we can't wait to get back to showing at the horse park.

The desert is beautiful, winter is around the corner, the facility is almost ready, we have a great competition planned...it's time to get going.

As you can imagine, there are a few things to cover as we prepare to launch our season. So here it goes.

- 1. We continue to invest in the horse park and the service we provide. With perhaps less fanfare than last summer, we continue to invest to improve your and your horses' experience at the horse park. We are always surprised by which improvements are most heralded, but collectively we think you'll see meaningful improvements everywhere you look.
- **A. Footing** We are scheduled to replace the footing in Hunter 5, 6 and 7, including its warm-up area, and in Jumper 2 warm-up. With this completed, the footing in all of the rings in the horse park will have been replaced. Needless to say, maintaining 1.6 million square feet of footing to the highest standard is a challenging task, and we continue to expand the resources and tools needed for this task.
- **B. Wash racks** We have expanded and upgraded the wash racks near Barn 1 and near Barns 15 and 17. With these completed, all of the wash racks have been upgraded at the horse park.

- C. Food offerings You'll find a host of new food outlets across from Jumper 2. We hope these outlets, which will include salads, a grill, and poke, will provide the right level of hospitality apart from VIP. You'll also see a roving cart offering complimentary refreshments every Friday, Saturday, and Sunday during all major circuits.
- **D. Parking** We will be offering an expanded shuttle service this season as well as a new reserved parking area behind barn 5. While parking will always be challenging, we hope these additions will continue to improve the options available.
- E. Tents/stalls This year we will complete the transition to clear span tents and 12x12 stalls. All of the stalls now offered will be 12x12 (except for a few supplemental tents located near barns 14/15 and barn 11 that provide stabling overflow capacity for these barns). We are proud that we offer the highest quality stabling of any facility around.

Grass, grass, and more grass – You'll find the grass keeps getting better.

We are really pleased with the condition of the grass competition field. Plus three acres of new grass for grazing and walking beyond the paddocks next to the schooling ring.

- F. Landscaping This is one challenge that will never end. But we continue to add trees and plants that increase the beauty of the horse park and to do our part for the environment.
- G. Scoreboards We have added permanent scoreboards/video boards in Hunter 1 and 2, Jumper 1, and on the grass field.
- H. Grass, grass, and more grass You'll find the grass keeps getting better. We are really pleased with the condition of the grass competition field. We also invested to improve the grass underneath the paddocks. And thanks to the generosity of one of our sponsors, we have added three acres of new grass for grazing and walking beyond the paddocks next to the schooling ring.
- 2. We have a very different schedule. At one level, the changes to our schedule are apparent: we have added a third week to Desert Holiday and a ninth week to Desert Circuit, with two off weeks instead of one. At another level, the more you look into the details of the schedule, the more changes you'll see. The reasons for these changes are complex, driven in large part by the USEF's decision to vacate the calendar and the need to build a competition that positions the horse park at the top of the sport. We encourage you to read the details to understand all of the changes that have been made, and we will be working hard to highlight the changes in our communication over the next several months.

- A. More weeks The redesign of our circuits started with the USEF's decision to vacate the calendar for 2023 and to have significant input into the California show calendar. For example, USEF would not support four weeks in a row of competition. Therefore, by definition, the Desert Circuit schedule had to change. Since we could not offer a competitive winter circuit with only six weeks of competition and because the shows would be too big, after much discussion with USEF, we opted to expand to nine weeks with two off-weeks. Starting earlier with nine weeks offers a number of important advantages. It has more weeks operating during cooler months and allows us to run smaller shows as riders opt to spread out which weeks they compete. We are excited about the shift in Desert Circuit, though are aware it will take a few years for people to sort out their preference for when to attend. The addition of the extra week in December brings back a fan favorite. While small, the passion for the third week of Desert Holiday is huge, and allows us to run a boutique show, with most of the jumper program on the grass field. We think more weeks gives more choice, which is good, and allows people to rest their horses without feeling pressure to "miss out" on a competition.
- B. An expanded high performance jumper program Our high-performance jumper program is critical to us. The West Coast needs a robust program which challenges the very best riders while bringing along horses and riders as they approach the top level. Our program this year will consist of three levels: a greatly expanded FEI tier for those riders aspiring to compete globally, a strong national standard \$50,000 Grand Prix program with a series championship during Desert Circuit IX, and a new 1.40m \$30,000 program with a series championship during Desert Circuit IX. We are thrilled with how this program has evolved and we believe it gives the best opportunity for riders and horses to develop at the right pace with the right challenge over the entire winter season.
- C. A commitment to Premier hunter On December 1, the USEF/USHJA hunter classifications change to a three-tier system. At the top level is Premier. The number of Premier shows across the country has been reduced dramatically and each Premier show must offer and pay a minimum of \$75,000 in prize money. You'll find that this shift has created fundamental changes in our competition schedule, most notably on Sundays when the Amateur Owner 3'3" and 3'6" Classics rise to \$10,000 competitions and the addition of an Amateur Owner 3'0" division with \$5,000 in prize money. With these, and a host of other changes added to the existing core elements in our Hunter program, such as our expansive USHJA National and International Derby series, we think we now have a hunter program that rivals any in the country. With 12 weeks of Premier Hunter shows, we think we stand alone in our commitment to hunter excellence.
- D. More championships We have expanded the number of formal championship events that occur at the horse park. These events include the Major League Show Jumping events, which now boasts a CSI 5* AA Grand Prix during DH II, the Onondarka Medal Finals during NSS II and the second \$100,000 WCHR West Coast Hunter Spectacular during NSS I (postponed from March). These are in addition to the existing events that we continue to invest in to make more special, including the CPHA Style of Riding Finals, the NCEA Medal Finals - West, our USHJA International Hunter Derby program, and the three weeks of WCHR we host.

- **E. An elevation of specialty classes** We believe that our specialty class program has been critical to creating a distinctive schedule and adding exciting new challenges for riders. This year we have elevated a number of these classes with the \$25,000 Pro Eq Challenge, the \$10,000 Hunter Team Challenge, the new 1.40m and National Standard Grand Prix series rider bonuses, and the addition of a 4-year-old young jumper class to add to our already strong young jumper and young hunter program.
- **3. Yes, we'll have a very different set of biosecurity plans in place.** Over the last several months, we have been working closely with USEF, UC Davis, and the CDFA. We, like you, don't want to ever have an outbreak of EHV-1 again. And the odds are we won't. But it is not that simple, and hope is not a strategy. The objectives are clear; we need to prevent sick horses from coming to horse shows, we need to prevent horses from getting sick at a horse show, we need to find horses that do get sick at a horse show, and we need to isolate and treat horses that do get sick. In conjunction with USEF and the other major winter circuits, we will be implementing new biosecurity plans. Collectively, we believe this is the best starting path, though we are all still learning, and we will adapt as we go. These plans include:
 - **A. New requirements for arrival** In advance of horses arriving at the horse park, owners/trainers will need to submit documentation that includes a health certificate as well as declarations on the health and status of each horse. These will be explained in more detail as we approach the start of the season but will be verified as horses arrive, prior to moving into stalls.
 - **B.** Monitoring procedures for horses on the property We will be requiring temperature checks for horses on the property and owners/trainers will be required to report febrile horses. These horses will be tested and kept separate until confirmation of test results.
 - **C. What to do if a horse gets sick** Rapid isolation and aggressive treatment are instrumental to preventing additional exposure and reducing the risk of EHM.

4. We will do our part, but need your help. We are a powerful community when we work together.

We operate a small city from November to March. And the safety of our community, both people and horses, depends on each other. We fully accept our responsibility and our role in making the horse park great and safe. But we need everyone to pitch in. Whether it is biosecurity, safe driving, protecting our youth, having our dogs on a leash, or quiet time in the barns at night, we can't – and don't want to – be a police force. We share a passion for our sport and that has to extend to each other. Please help us make the horse park an amazing and safe place to be.

At the outset, our objective was simple: create a great horse park.



create a great horse park. We described that there were three components; the physical facility, the hospitality, and the competition. While we will continually improve the physical facility, more of the changes from now on will be incremental. In short, the big stuff has been done. It is a huge task to keep it maintained and fresh, which we will do. And we learn each year the small things that need to be done. But the basics of our physical facility will be the same for the future. Our hospitality, and how our guests feel while here, is an area of focus for us now. It has many elements, from our food offerings to how we handle parking. We have a lot to improve here, and we are focused on it every single day. We certainly appreciate your input. This year, as described above, we are making a significant investment in the competition program. This investment involves as much money over time as the investment in the physical facility. There are lots of details involved in the three components. But it can be best described this way: we believe the West Coast needs a national/international destination for riders of all levels. We believe that Desert International Horse Park can be that destination that provides people on the West Coast the same opportunity to ride and compete that exists on the East Coast. Over time, we believe people from all over will want to compete here, even if just for a few weeks. There is nothing that makes us prouder than seeing the best riders in the world ride in a CSI5* event here, except perhaps seeing a seven-year-old on his/her pony collecting a first blue ribbon.

5. Our aspiration is the same. At the outset, when we purchased the horse park, our objective was simple:

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin,

and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").





EQUINE HEALTH AND BIOSECURITY REQUIREMENTS

DIHP will detail new Biosecurity Protocols and Practices by October 1. These new protocols and practices have been developed in consultation with UC Davis, CDFA, Merck Animal Health, and the USEF EHV-1 Committee. The new protocols and practices will require additional documentation regarding the health of horses arriving at the DIHP. These include the following below:"

1) PROOF OF VACCINATION AND COMPLIANCE WITH GR844

Required

Via a signed statement from the attending veterinarian that the horse has been vaccinated against the following:

Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: Equine Influenza (EIV)

Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: Rhinopneumonitis (EHV 1 and EHV 4)

If a vaccination will expire during one of the shows, the horse must receive its new vaccination prior to being issued a competition number for that show. Statement of vaccination must be on Official Letterhead and must contain the Show Name of each horse.

If the vaccine has been administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor must provide, upon request, a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; the name, serial number, and expiration date of the vaccine; and the date of the vaccine administration.

2) INTERSTATE OR INTRASTATE HEALTH CERTIFICATE (CVI)

Required

These document must be submitted prior to the arrival of the horse to the showgrounds. The CVI must indicate the horse's registered (show) name, and be signed by an accredited USDA veterinarian within 7 days of arrival.

3) USEF DECLARATION OF HEALTH

Required

Via a signed statement by owner/trainer for each horse declaring that:

- a) Horse has not had a fever above 101.5 or (101.1) if the horse is taking NSAIDs or any other fever suppressing treatment drug during the last 72 hours.
- b) Horse has not been exposed to or treated for a fever of unknown origin within the last 28 days
- c) Horse has received a negative EHV-1 test within the last 30 days if it had previously tested positive during the past 6 months



To be scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is not permissible in any round.

ROUND 1: To be shown over a Hunter Classic course of at least 10 fences. In addition to the base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped. Scores will be added to determine the total score for the round. The top 12 will return in reverse of scores for the Second Round. In the case of ties, the Base score of the tie-breaking panel will be used to break the tie.

ROUND 2: To be shown over a Handy Hunter course of at least 8 fences. In addition to the base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped. Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. Scores will be added to determine the total score for the round. In the case of ties, the Base score of the tie-breaking panel will be used to break the tie.

Scores from Round 1 and Round 2 will be added to determine the overall winners. In the case of a tie for First Place, a jump-off will be held. In the case of ties for all other places, the Base score of the Round 2 tie-breaking panel will be used to break the tie.

POINTS AND AWARDS - In order to earn USEF Horse of the Year points, exhibitors must declare in which section points are to count by submitting a completed USHJA Declaration

Form to the Show Office by the end of the competition. Points accrued by horses shown by Professionals may be awarded to the declared Green Hunter 3'0", Green Hunter 3'3" Performance Hunter 3'3" or Small Hunter. Points accrued by horses shown by Juniors or Amateurs may be awarded to the declared Green Hunter 3'0", Green Hunter 3'3" Performance Hunter 3'3", or the applicable Children's, Pony, Adult Amateur, Amateur Owner 3'3", Small Hunter or Junior Hunter 3'3. The money won and points won in the USHJA National Hunter Derby will only be awarded towards a declared Hunter section for HOTY points if a horse competes in the declared section a minimum of 1 time during the competition year. National HOTY championship points will not be awarded. (see HU192.9b)

SECURE STABLING - Horses must purchase a stall and be stabled on the grounds 24 hours prior to the start of the class. Horses must remain on the competition grounds until finished competing in the Derby. Any horse in violation of this requirement will be disqualified.

HORSE INSPECTION - Horses entered in this class will NOT be required to jog for soundness. Any unsoundness during the competition will be reflected in the scores from the judges (GR 1033.6).

SCHOOLING REQUIREMENTS - During the 24 hour period prior to the class, horses must be ridden in official horse show schooling areas only unless Management designates a specific schooling area for National Hunter Derby horses. Competition number must be worn at all times while mounted.

ORDER OF GO - The Order of Go for the First Round will be drawn. The Order for the Second Round will be reverse order of scores from Round 1. Should a jump-off occur, horses will return in the same order in which they competed in the second round.

ATTIRE - Refer to HU128 in the USEF Rule Book for current specifications.

RIBBONS AND AWARDS - Ribbons 1-12 for Overall.

\$25,000 USHJA INTERNATIONAL HUNTER DERBY

CLASS FEE: \$600 CLASS NUMBER: 710

I. MEMBERSHIP AND PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS-

- **A.** Riders, Owners and Trainers must be current Active members. of USEF and USHJA before the start of the class.
- B. Horses must be recorded with the Federation and registered with USHJA.
- C. Exception: Foreign residents and horses in good standing with their National Federation are eligible to compete in this class. However the points and/or money won will not count for any USEF or USHJA standings or awards unless they are also members of USEF and USHJA, and the horse is recorded with USEF and registered with USHJA.
- D. The same horse may not compete in the USHJA International Hunter Derby and the National Hunter Derby at the same competition.
- E. Horses entered in this class are not required to show in any other hunter or jumper classes at the horse show.
- F. Riders are limited to competing no more than four (4) horses in each class, however, a competition may choose to further limit the number of horses a rider can compete to three (3) horses, as long as the competition notifies the USHJA 60 days in advance of the date of the class and such limitation is printed in the prize list.
- G. Attire: Refer to HU107 in the USEF Rule Book for current specifications.
- H. In accordance with HU174.14 the same horse-and-rider combination must compete in both rounds of the International Hunter Derby.

II. BONUS POINTS AND AWARDS

- A. In order for International Hunter Derby National HOTY bonus points/money to be awarded, riders must complete the USHJA Exhibitor Declaration Form which must be submitted to the show office by the end of the competition.
- B. National HOTY bonus points/money are awarded to each horse's respective section as declared at the time of entry. Riders may only declare one hunter section (not including Green Conformation Hunter 3'6" and the High Performance Conformation Hunter, per HU167.3) for National HOTY points/money. Only Juniors or Amateurs may declare for the applicable Junior or Amateur Owner section. Horses declared in open sections will be awarded both bonus points and the value of their money won for their declared hunter section, toward the appropriate HOTY standings. (See HU167.3 for bonus point structure.)

D. For USHJA Awards purposes, a computer ranking system tracks the money won for both the horse and rider, both nationally and regionally.

III. ENROLLMENT POLICY-INTERNATIONAL HUNTER DERBY PROGRAM

- A. Horses must be enrolled to participate in a USHJA International Hunter Derby. Exception: Exhibitors may show in a maximum of one class in the series year without enrollment. Only enrolled horses are eligible for Regional Awards, to be included on the USHJA IHD Money Won list and to compete in any Derby Championship.
 - 1. Upon enrollment in the Derby Program, horses' earnings, from date of enrollment forward through June 1, 2022, will be included on the USHJA International Hunter Derby Money Won list and count toward Regional Awards. Horses must be enrolled in the program before competing in a Derby, if they wish the money won in that Derby to count toward standings, regardless of the start date of the competition.
 - 2. Money (and points) won by horses not enrolled in the Derby Program will not be included on the USHJA International Hunter Derby Money Won list or Regional Award Standings.
 - 3. Owners must declare their horse's region upon enrollment of the horse and the region may not be changed during the Derby Series year.
 - 4. Owners may choose one region in which to declare their horse(s); the region declared does not have to be the owner's home region.
 - 5. Regions are generally based on the number and location of Derby Series classes (June 2 to June 1) and are as
 - ✓ North Region: Includes Zones 1 and 2.
 - ✓ South Region: Includes Zones 3 and 4.
 - ✓ North Central Region: Includes Zones 5 and 6.
 - ✓ South Central Region: Includes Zone 7.
 - ✓ Northwest Region: Includes Zones 9 and 12, and British Columbia
 - ✓ Southwest Region: Includes 8, 10 and 11.
- B. Annual Enrollment Fee: \$450 and enrollment begins on December 1 of current year. Horses may only be enrolled online and it is the exhibitor's responsibility to enroll his horse in a timely manner in order to be eligible to receive credit for money won. There will be no exceptions allowed regarding enrollment dates for program eligibility.

IV. JOG FORMAT - BEGINNING DECEMBER 1, 2021

- A. All horses entered in the International Hunter Derby class must jog for soundness during the Official Jog prior to the start of the first round in order to compete. The Official Jog must be held within 12 hours of the start of the first round. This jog will be run in a manner similar to an FEI jog.
- B. A horse must be officially entered in the class before it will be allowed to jog.
- C. Proper attire is required (i.e., riding clothes or proper attire which an exhibitor would wear to compete in a model class).
- D. All horses must be presented at the Official Jog with their actual competition number and wearing a conventional hunter bridle, including noseband.
- E. The judging panel for the Official Jog shall consist of the

- competition veterinarian and a minimum of one judge from the judging panels officiating for the class.
- F. The jog surface must be level. Horses shall be evaluated from the side and following consultation with the veterinarian, the decision of the participating judge(s) is final and binding and not subject to further appeal of any kind.
- G. If a horse does not pass the jog; the exhibitor may request to re-present the horse to the judge(s). The judge(s) may decide to allow the horse to re-present at any time up to one hour prior to the start of the class. The vet and one of the judges from the original panel must be present.

V. STABLING/SCHOOLING

- A. All horses competing in the Derby class must be on the competition grounds a minimum of 24 hours prior to the start of the first round of the class.
- B. All horses will be monitored and must remain on the competition grounds until the horse is finished competing in the Derby class. Any horse that leaves the premises prior to completing its participation in the Derby class is disqualified.
- C. All horses must be ridden in official horse show schooling areas unless competition management designates a specific schooling area for derby horses. Riders must wear the horses' competition number while mounted.

VI. ORDER OF GO

- A. The order of go must be posted a minimum of one hour prior to the start of the class.
- B. In the case of multiple horses being ridden by the same rider, every effort will be made so that there will be a minimum of eight horses (if available) separating multiple rides. All horses must be ridden in the sequence that appears on the jumping order in the first round of the competition. In the second round horses will return in reverse order of their first round scores (lowest to highest). When multiple rides occur, competition management will determine a fair separation between horses for the order of go. Should a jump-off occur, horses will return in the same order in which they competed in the second round.
- C. The draw may be performed by hand or competition management may host a computer draw.

VII. JUDGING SYSTEM

- A. The Classic Hunter Style Round shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. In addition to this base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped. These two scores must be announced separately and then added together to determine each horse-andrider combination's score for this round from each judging panel. The scores of all the judging panels will be added together to determine the total score of each horse-and-rider combination for this round.
- B. The Handy Hunter Round shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is NOT permissible. In addition to this base score each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped and each judging panel must award a Handy Bonus Score consisting of between zero and 10 bonus points to each

horse-and-rider combination for handiness of round. These three scores must be announced separately and then added together to determine each horse-and-rider combination's score for this round from each judging panel. The scores of all the judging panels will be added together to determine the total score of each horse- and-rider combination for this round.

- 1. Suggested Handy Bonus Points
 - a. 0-3 Points: No increase in pace, few if any inside options taken, lack of brilliance
 - b. 4-6 Points: Minimal increase in pace, some inside options taken, medium brilliance
 - c. 7-9 Points: Major increase in pace, multiple inside options taken, strong effort and brilliance
 - d. 10 Points: Maximum handiness to include major increase in pace, multiple inside options taken, strong effort and brilliance
- C. The Jump-Off Round, if required, shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is NOT permissible. In addition to this base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped and each judging panel must award a Handy Bonus Score consisting of between zero and 10 bonus points to each horse-andrider combination for handiness of round. These three scores must be announced separately and then added together to determine each horse-and-rider combination's score for this round from each judging panel. The scores of all the judging panels will be added together to determine the total score of each horse- and-rider combination for this
- D. The total scores of each horse-and-rider combination from each round will be added together to determine their final overall Hunter Derby score. This score will determine the final overall standings for the class.
- E. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point for each higher height option fence jumped must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-andrider combination does jump the higher height option fence.
- F. Alternatively, the Hunt and Go option (Formula B) may be utilized in lieu of the traditional format (Formula A). The Hunt and Go format will consist of two phases, one Classic Hunter and one Handy Hunter. The phases will be jumped consecutively. All participants will complete both the Classic and the Handy portions even if penalties (rails, refusals, etc.) are incurred. Major penalties (falls, 3 refusals, off course, etc.) will result in elimination.
 - 1. Standard Hunt and Go Format
 - a. The Classic Hunter Round, consisting of 7-8 fences with 2 high options, shall be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going.
 - b. After the completion of the classic round horses will pick up their pace and pass through a set of markers to begin their handy portion of the class. The Handy Hunter Round, consisting of 5-8 fences with 2 high options, shall be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace, brilliance, and a shorter track are to be rewarded. A horse/rider may not jump decorations or other obstacles in order to create a shorter track.
 - c. Two scores will be given by each judging panel, with

- one score for the Classic Round and one score for the Handy Round. Bonus points of one point per high option jump will be added to each judging panel's score. The scores from each panel will be added together to determine the total score and placement. Prior to the start of the class one judging panel must be designated as the tie breaker.
- d. A judging assistant must be present during all phases of the competition. The duties of the judging assistant include notifying the Judges if a rail comes down and when a horse jumps the higher height option fences. The judging assistant is not required to be a licensed official and is not responsible for the scoring of the judging panels. A competition staff member may fill this role.
- e. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point for each higher height option fence jumped must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse- and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence.

VIII. TIE BREAKING PROCEDURES

- A. Neither judging panel may award the same base score to any two competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score.
- B. In all formats (including Hunt and Go) Panel 1 breaks the ties for the Classic round/phase, Panel 2 breaks the tie for the Handy round/phase and Panel 1 breaks ties in the overall.
- C. Unless the prize list states that more than twelve (12) entries are to return for the second round, only the top twelve (12) horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.
- D. All ties for overall first place in the class will compete in a jumpoff round. In the case of unsafe conditions preventing a jump-

- off from being held, the tie will be broken using the second round base score (before adding height and handy bonus points), of the designated jump-off tie breaking judging panel.
- E. Ties for other than first place in the overall standings will be broken using the second round score

IX. PRIZE MONEY AND ENTRY FEE

A. Prize money must be paid to a minimum of 12 places as follows:

- B. If there are fewer than twelve (12) entries in the class, prize money must be paid according to the breakdown in Section IX.A, through the last placing entry. Any remaining prize money not awarded due to fewer than twelve (12) entries may be split and awarded equally to all entrants that place in the class.
- C. A minimum of \$10,000 prize money must be offered per

\$5,000 USHJA NATIONAL PONY DERBY

I. MEMBERSHIP AND PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

- A. Riders, owners, and trainers must be current Active members of the Federation and USHJA to participate in this class.
- B. Ponies must be registered with USHJA to participate in thisclass.
- C. Ponies must have a valid measurement card or form issued by the Federation.
- **D.** Exception: Foreign residents and ponies in good standing with their National Federation are eligible to compete in this
- E. USHJA National and Zone HOTY points will only be awarded if the owner is a current Active member of the Federation and USHJA and the pony is recorded with the Federation and registered with USHJA.
- F. Points earnedwill only count for any USHJA Pony Hunter Derby standings or awards if the rider, owner and trainer are current Active members of the Federation and USHJA, and the pony is registered with USHJA.
- G. Riders may compete on a total of four ponies but no more than two of any one size.
- H. Rider age and pony size: See HU101 for current Federation policy. Any rider under the age of 18 years may compete on any pony that is eligible for the Green Pony Hunter section provided that pony has been declared to earn HOTY points in the Green Pony Hunter section.
- I. The prize list may specify that in order to be eliqible to compete in a Pony Hunter Derby, a pony must compete in one or two classes at the same competition.
- J. In accordance with HU174.14 the same pony-and-rider combination must compete in both rounds of the Pony Hunter Derby.
- K. A Green pony that competes in a USHJA PonyHunter Derby is no longer eligible for green reinstatement.
- L. Attire: Refer to HU107 in the Federation Rule Book for current specifications.

II. HOTY POINTS AND AWARDS

- A. National and Zone HOTY points will be awarded for placing in a USHJA Pony Hunter Derby.
- B. In order for Pony Hunter Derby National and Zone HOTY points to be awarded:
 - 1. Ponies must be recorded with the Federation and registered with USHJA.
 - 2. Recorded owner of ponymust be a current Active member of the Federation and USHJA.
 - 3. Riders must complete the USHJA Exhibitor Declaration Form prior to the conclusion of the competition.
 - 4. A minimum of six (6) ponies must compete in the first round at Premier and National rated competitions and

- competitions that have been approved for a Special Competition classification.
- 5. A minimum of six (6) ponies must compete in the first round at Regional I and Regional II rated competitions.
- C. Riders may only declare one pony hunter section, per competition, in which to earn HOTY points. Children's Pony may not be declared for HOTY points.
- **D.** A pony eligible to be shown in the Green Pony Hunter section may be declared to earn HOTY points in the applicable Green Pony Hunter section.
- E. Base National HOTY points will be awarded for the overall placings as follows:

One additional point per pony entered will be added to the base National HOTY points earned

F. Base Zone HOTY points will be awarded for the overall placings as follows:

IV. ORDER OF GO

- **A.** The order of go must be posted a minimum of one hour prior to the start of the class.
- **B.** In the case of multiple ponies being ridden by the same rider, every effort will be made so that there will be a minimum of eight ponies (if available) separating multiple rides. All ponies must be ridden in the sequence that appears on the jumping order in the first round of the competition. In the second round ponies will return in reverse order of their first round scores (lowest to highest). Due to multiple rides or rider conflicts, any rider may elect to move up in the order. Should a jump-off occur, ponies will return in the same order in which they competed in the second round.
- C. The draw may be performed by hand or Competition Management may host a computer draw.

V. JUDGING SYSTEM

- A. The judging panel will provide one score and the scores from each round will be added together to obtain the overall total for each pony. This overall total score will determine the final overall standings for the class.
- B. The Classic Hunter Style Round shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to berewarded.
- C. The Handy Hunter Round shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is NOT permissible.

\$5,000 USHJA PONY HUNTER DERBY (con't)

- D. The Jump-Off Round, if required, shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is NOT permissible.
- E. Where not included in the specifications, the USEF rules for pony hunters will apply.

VI. TIE BREAKING PROCEDURES

- A. The judging panel may not award the same base score to any two competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score.
- B. Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, only the top 12 ponies from the first round are eligible to return for the second round.
- C. All ties for overall first place in the class will compete in a jump-off round. In the case of unsafe conditions preventing a jump-off from being held, the tie will be broken using the second roundscore.
- D. Ties for other than first place in the overall standings will be broken using the second round score.

VII. AWARDS PRESENTATION

- A. Judges are required to pin to 12th place (plus two reserve placings).
- **B.** All riders in the top 12 overall (or their designated representative if not available) must ride for ribbons in order to receive prize money.
- C. Although not required, a show may choose to award separate ribbons for the first and second round if so stated in the prize list.
- **D.** Competition management may offer additional awards. (e.g., highest placing junior owner, highest placing pony per size small, medium, large, highest placing rider competingon only one entry in the class.)

VIII. PRIZE MONEY AND ENTRY FEE

A. Prize money must be paid to a minimum of 12 places as

1st - 30%, 2nd - 22%, 3rd - 13%, 4th - 8%, 5th - 6%, 6th -5%, 7th - 4%, 8th - 3%, 9th - 3%, 10th - 2%, 11th - 2%, 12th - 2%

- 1. Competitions wishing to offer additional prize money above the minimum required (including any add-back money if applicable) and pay additional placings must print the information in the prize list and notify the USHJA of the final prize money distribution. If a change in prize money and placings occurs after the prize list is printed, the competition must follow all Federation rules regarding changes to the prize list (See GR904). The prize money awarded to each placing below 12th place must not exceed the amount awarded to 12th place.
- B. If there are less than 12 entries in the class, prize money must be paid according to the breakdown in Section VIII.A through the last placing entry. Any remaining prize money not awarded due to less than 12 entries may be split and awarded equally to all entrants that place in the class.
- C. A minimum of \$1,500 prize money must be offered per class at Premier and National rated competitions and competitions that have been approved for a Special Competition classification.
- **D.** A minimum of \$1,000 prize money must be offered per class at Regional I rated competitions.
- E. A minimum of \$500 prize money must be offered per class at Regional II rated competitions.
- F. A competition may choose to offer add-back prize money in addition to the prize money offered, however, the minimum required prize money must be guaranteed. If add-back prize money will be offered, this must be stated in the prize list.
- G. The entry fee, including the per pony entrant fee, cannot exceed 10% of the prize money offered.

USHJA GREEN HUNTER INCENTIVE PROGRAM 2022 STAKE CLASS

*Effective for competitions starting December 1, 2021 November 30, 2022

I. Membership and Participation Requirements

- A. Open to horses of any age that are eligible to compete as a Green 3'0", 3'3", 3'6" or 3'9" Hunter under Federation rules. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to verify eligibility of the horse.
- B. Riders, owners, and trainers must be current Active members of USEF and USHJA to participate in this class. (see GR202).
- C. Horses must be enrolled in the USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Program and pay the annual enrollment fee to participate in the Green Incentive Stake. Additionally, horses must be registered with USHJA and recorded with USEF to participate. Horses must be enrolled in the Green Hunter Incentive Program prior to competing in a Green Hunter Incentive Stake class. Only horses appearing on the enrolled list located at www.ushja.org are eligible to compete in a Green Hunter Incentive Stake class. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to enroll their horse in a timely manner in order to be eligible to participate.
- D. Horses may only be enrolled online. If a horse is enrolled during a competition, the horse's enrollment date will be considered the first day of the competition at which it was enrolled.
- E. Slots: Owners may purchase a slot in the program at the current rate and name a horse to that slot at a later date. Only results achieved by the horse after it is assigned to the slot will count in program standings and qualifying for championships. Slots expire at the end of the competition year the same as the regular enrollment. They are non-transferrable; they cannot be sold to another owner and a horse cannot be substituted for one already assigned. Any slots that are unused will stay dedicated to the current year's purse and will not roll over.
- F. Enrolled horses are not required to have competed in a Green Hunter section at any USEF Licensed Competition to compete in a Stake class. However, competing in a Stake class will affect their Green status.
- G. Horses are not required to jog for soundness.
- **H.** Horses may be ridden by a Professional, Junior or Amateur.
- I. There is no limit to the number of horses a rider may compete in the class.

II. Judging Format

- A. The Green Hunter Incentive Stake class shall be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going, using the open numerical scoring system.
- B. A score will be announced after each round.
- C. If the Incentive is run concurrently with another class, judges will compare incentive horses against the other incentive horses, not against the green hunter entries.
- D. If the number of entries warrant splitting the class, it is recommended to split it by fence height first rather than California split.
- E. The class will be judged by a minimum of one Registered (Large R) USEF Hunter Licensed judge at Premier and National rated competitions and competitions that have been approved for a Special Competition status, and a minimum of one Registered (Large R) or Recorded (Small R) USEF Hunter Licensed judge at Regional I and Regional II rated competitions.

III. Prize Money and Entry Fee

A. Prize money must be paid to a minimum of 12 places as follows:

1st-30%	7th-4%
2nd-22%	8th-3%
3rd-13%	9th-3%
4th-8%	10th-2%
5th-6%	11th-2%
6th-5%	12th-2%

- B. If there are fewer than 12 entries in the class, prize money must be paid according to the breakdown in Section III.A, through the last placing entry. Any remaining prize money not awarded due to fewer than 12 entries may be split and awarded equally to all entrants that place in the class.
- C. Each USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Stake class section, i.e. 3'/3'3, and 3'6/3'9, is to offer \$1,000.00 minimum prize money at Premier or National rated shows, however, if there are fewer than four horses in each section, the sections may be combined for a total \$1,000.00 prize money minimum. If there are more than four in one section and fewer than four in another section, the sections may be combined with a total of \$1500.00 minimum prize money. Regional shows must offer \$500 each or \$750 if combined.
 - 1. Competitions wishing to offer additional prize money above the minimum required (including any add-back money if applicable) and pay additional placings must print the information in the prize list and notify the USHJA of the final prize money distribution. If a change in prize money and placings occurs after the prize list is printed, the competition must follow all USEF rules regarding changes to the prize list (See GR904). The prize money awarded to each placing below 12th place must not exceed the amount awarded to 12th place.
- D. 50% of each entry fee received, excluding the USHJA per entry fee, must be added to the total amount of prize money offered for this class.
- E. Rider Ranking System- Show managers may award additional prize money above the required prize money amounts, at their discretion to the highest-placing Tier II riders (list available on the USHJA website as of Dec.). Tier II money must not exceed the money awarded for the rest of the class. Show managers may secure Tier II money through a non-allocated additional percentage of entry fees or through sponsorships.
- F. It is suggested that a competition should not charge an entry fee exceeding 10% of the prize money offered in the class.

IV. HOTY Points

National Horse of the Year points/money are awarded to each horse's respective Green Hunter height section. Horses will be awarded both HOTY points and the value of their money won for their green hunter section, toward the appropriate HOTY and money won standings.

A. The USHJA Green Hunter Incentive classes will count toward National and Zone HOTY points or money won awards. *Points may not be credited toward the HOTY awards for the Green Conformation Hunter 3'6" or the High Performance Conformation Hunter.

V. Course Requirements

- A. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the class.
- B. Fences must be set at 3'0", 3'3", 3'6" or 3'9" in height in accordance with how management chooses to offer and conduct the class.

VI. Competition Format GREEN HUNTER 3'/3'3" INCENTIVE STAKE CLASS

- A. Competitions may offer both fence heights (3'0"/3'3") within the same class.
- B. If a competition holds a Green Hunter 3'0" section plus a Green Hunter 3'3" section, a USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Stake class may be held at each height section.
- C. Up to two USHJA sets of Green Hunter 3'0"/3'3" Incentive Stake classes may be held at a given competition as long as one is run the same day as the corresponding Green Hunter section.
 - 1. If the number of entries warrant, the combined 3'0"/3'3" can be split by fence height. All four Green Hunter fence heights may not be combined under any circumstance.
- D. The one round USHJA Green Hunter Incentive class may be held concurrently with a class of an existing Green Hunter 3'0", 3'3", section or as a standalone class.
 - 1. If the Stake is held as a standalone class, no other class may be held concurrently with the Stake.
 - 2. If the class is held concurrently with a class of an existing Green Hunter section, the rider must enter the USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Stake class separately from the Green Hunter corresponding height section in order to be eligible for the additional prize money.

GREEN HUNTER 3'6/3'9" INCENTIVE STAKE CLASS

- E. Competitions may offer both fence heights (3'6"/3'9") within the same class.
- F. If a competition holds a Green Hunter 3'6" section plus a Green Hunter 3'9" section, a USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Stake class may be held at each height section.
- G. Up to two USHJA sets of Green Hunter 3'6"/3'9" Incentive Stake classes may be held at a given competition as long as one is run the same day as the corresponding Green Hunter section.

- 1. If the number of entries warrant, the combined 3'6"/3'9" can be split by fence height. All four Green Hunter fence heights may not be combined under any circumstance.
- H. The one round USHJA Green Hunter Incentive class may be held concurrently with a class of an existing Green Hunter 3'6" or 3'9", GREEN CONFORMATION HUNTER 3'6" or HIGH PERFORMANCE CONFORMATION HUNTER section or as a standalone class.
 - 1. If the Stake is held as a standalone class, no other class may be held concurrently with the Stake.
 - 2. If the class is held concurrently with a class of an existing Green Hunter, GREEN CONFORMATION, or HIGH PERFORMANCE CONFORMATION HUNTER section, the rider must enter the USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Stake class separately from the corresponding height section in order to be eligible for the additional prize money.
 - 3. Eligible Green Hunters competing in the CONFORMATION sections (GREEN & HIGH PERFORMANCE) can utilize the score from that section if the horse jumped the same course, in the same ring, the same day, in front of the same judge. Horses that compete in both the Green Hunter and the Conformation under the stipulated conditions for concurrent judging will be judged for the Incentive class the first time the horse attempts the designated course in those sections.

VII. Competition Requirements

- A. The USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Stake class may be held at any USEF Premier, National, Regional I or Regional II rated hunter competition, or competitions that have been approved for a Special Competition status.
- B. No separate application is necessary for a competition to hold this class.
- C. Competitions must offer two sections of Green Hunter Incentive Stake: 3'/3'3" and 3'6/3'9.
- D. Competition management will collect and remit to USHJA a fee of \$20 per entry at Premier and National rated competitions and competitions that have been approved for a Special Competition status, and \$10 per entry at Regional I and Regional II rated competitions within 10 days of the end of the competition.
- E. Competition management must check at www.ushja.org to verify that all entries in the USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Stake have been officially enrolled in the Green Hunter Incentive Program, prior to the distribution of prize money for the Green Hunter Incentive Stake class.
- F. If there are any Stake class entries, the Stake class must be run.
- G. Competition management must report the results of this class separately from the results of the Green Hunter height section classes and send a copy of these results to both the USEF and USHJA within 10 days of the conclusion of the competition.
- H. Competitions are responsible for all class awards. However, the USHJA reserves the right to supplement awards.
- I. The USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Stake class should be promoted and conducted by management as one of the featured classes of the competition.

EQUITATION PROGRAM

The Desert International Horse Park Equitation program is designed to challenge riders as they prepare for national competition with a set of unique equitation jumps and courses replicating the situations seen at major medal competitions, all presented in a dedicated equitation ring.

1.30/1.35m Platinum Jumper Championship – Juniors, Amateurs and Professionals 1.40/1.45m Platinum Jumper Championships - Juniors, Amateurs and Professionals

I. **MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

- A. Eligible athletes must be a current active USEF and USHJA member in good standing (see GR201& JP 100.1) from the time of application until conclusion of event.
- B. The horse must be registered with USHJA (see JP 100.2) and recorded with USEF pursuant to USEFGR 1102, in good standing under USEF rules.
- C. The burden of proof of eligibility to compete will rest with and be the sole responsibility of the owner or athlete, and not of the USHJA. USHJA staff is not available to determine each horse's or athlete eligibility.
- D. The zone of each Athlete is determined by the athlete's point state as recorded with USEF as of December 1,2021 (see JP 100.5)
- E. Athletes wishing to participate in the USHJA Platinum Jumper Championship must complete and submit an application online at ushja.org/platinum jumper no later than 45 days prior to the start of their respective Championship. The applicants must certify that they meet the qualification and eligibility conditions delineated herein.
 - Application: December 1 through seven days prior each Zone or Combined Zone Championship. Fee of \$75 per athlete/horse combination. \$25 per additional athlete/horse combination applied.
- F. Refer to "Zone Eligibility Requirements" for important dates and deadlines.

II. **OUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR ATHLETE/HORSE COMBINATIONS**

- A. An athlete/ horse *combination is* eligible to compete on one team at the Platinum Championships. 1.30/1.35m and 1.40/1.45m Platinum Jumper Championships are open to Juniors, Amateurs, and Professionals. If qualified and eligible, an athlete may compete in both the 1.30/1.35m and 1.40/1.45m Championships on different horses.
- B. In order to be eligible for the 1.30/1.35m Platinum Championships, athlete/horse combinations must earn a minimum of 250 points/money won in 1.30/1.35m classes at USEF licensed competitions 45 days
- C. prior to the start of their championship. Exceptions: II.H.I Waivers and II.I Substitutions.
- D. In order to be eligible for the 1.40/1.45m Platinum Championships, athlete/horse combinations must earn a minimum of 250 points/money won in 1.40/1.45m classes at USEF licensed competitions 45 days prior to the start of their championship. Exceptions: II.H.I Waivers and II.I Substitutions.
- E. The point standings (ranking) in each zone starts 30 days following the conclusion of the previous year's Platinum Championship to 45 days prior to the start of the current year's Championship, will be used to determine the athlete/horse combination's acceptance to compete in that combined zone championships. Exceptions: II.H.I Waivers and II.I Substitutions.
- F. Ties will be broken by the most first place finishes in qualifying classes, at their respective



height. If ties still exist, the most second place finishes in qualifying classes at the respective height will be used and so on until the tie is broken.

- G. Platinum Championships must accept a minimum of three teams and a maximum of eight teams in each height section.
- H. 1.30/1.35m athlete/horse combinations electing to compete in the Platinum Championships may not have competed in a class held at a height over 1.45m the current competition year.
- I. 1.40/145m Athlete/horse combinations wishing to compete in the Platinum Championships may not have competed in an Open High Performance Standard Grand Prix in the current competition year.(JP123.4d)
- J. Platinum athletes may compete in classes that have heights greater than the maximum height restriction for the Platinum Championships on a different horse.
- K. Waivers must be submitted at least seven days prior to the championships. Any waivers submitted after the deadline will not be considered.
 - 1. If an athlete has an extenuating circumstance and wishes to apply for a waiver to any of the requirements in Section I, the athlete must apply to the USHJA explaining the circumstances and details. The USHJA will appoint a group of jumper representatives who will evaluate the request and provide a final decision whether to accept or deny the waiver.
 - 2. Waivers will not be granted for classes that do not meet the minimum fence height.
 - 3. In no case will a waiver include any classes that occur less than 45 days before the Championship when the point standings freeze.
 - 4. Waivers will not be granted for athlete/*horse combinations* that have jumped over the maximum height restrictions more than *three* times within the qualifying period.

L. Substitutions

- 1. Once the definite entries are secured, and up to seven days preceding the Monday of the Championship, if an eligible athlete/horse combination is unable to compete at the Championship, the space will be filled by the next available *athlete/horse* combination from the frozen point standings list. If a horse is unable to compete and that athlete has another horse that is eligible in the standings with 250 points.
- 2. After the seven-day deadline, if a horse is unable to compete and the athlete has another eligible horse, a substitution will be allowed under the following conditions:
 - The horse has at least 250 points at the appropriate height.
 - If the qualifying points were won within 21 days of the championships, the athlete must present a copy of the official results from the qualifying horse show(s) displaying the height of the class(s) and the placing of the horse.
 - The substituted horse must have earned its qualifying points with the athlete seeking the substitution.
 - All substitutions must take place prior to the start of the horse inspection.
- 3. Once the first round of the championship commences, no changes in team composition will be allowed for any reason. If a three-member team is reduced to two, those riders will compete as individuals.
- 4. If there are at least three individuals from different zones in a combined zone championship before the first competition, they may comprise a combined team upon approval of the USHJA Jumper Technical Delegate.
- 5. To hold a Platinum Championship, a minimum of three teams must be entered. Teams may



be combined by zone.

6. There is no substitution of a horse once the horse inspection has been completed.

M. Qualifying List

- 1. Athlete/horse combinations for the Platinum Championships will be accepted from the USHJA Platinum Jumper Championship Qualifying List (standings) found on the USHJA website: ushja.org/platinum jumper.
- 2. Combined Zones: Each Zone may send up to 16 qualified athlete/horse combinations. Should a Zone be unable to send 16 qualified athlete/horse combinations the other competing Zone may send more than their allotted 16 combinations until a maximum of 32 athlete/horse combinations have been accepted.
- 3. Should the maximum number of 32 athlete/horse combinations not be met in any section, an athlete may ask to be included in the Championship at the Platinum Jumper Championship site. The athlete/horse combination must meet eligibility requirements and apply to the USHJA representative at the Championship competition 24 hours before the horse inspection. If a team position is unavailable, the additional athlete/horse combination will compete as an individual.
- 4. It is the intention of the USHJA to allow as much flexibility as possible within the parameters of sound, fair, friendly competition, and good sport in the allowance of teams to be combined at events should a competitor drop out due to sickness or injury.

III. RULES AND REGULATIONS

Horse Rules and Regulations

A. Horse Inspection

- 1. Championship horses must be stabled in official competition stabling on the show grounds where the championship is being held. Horses must be in their assigned horse show stabling at least one hour prior to the horse inspection, and horses must remain on the grounds until the completion of their Championship.
- 2. Horses competing in the Championship may not compete in any other class at the same horse show after the Official horse inspection has taken place.
- 3. All Championship horses must be presented at the mandatory horse inspection by the athlete or designated representative. The horse inspection will be held not more than 24 hours prior to the start of the First Individual Qualifying Class. The exact time and location will be included in the prize list and schedule for each championship.
- 4. A designated representative for the horse must be present at the *horse inspection*.
- 5. Each horse must be presented with its entry number and current negative Coggins. Following the official horse inspection, the assigned back number must accompany the horse at all times when it is out of its stall and must be visible on the stall door when the horse is in its stall.
- 6. Horses not accepted at the horse inspection will have the opportunity to be re-presented once prior to the First Individual Qualifying Class.
- 7. If a horse is not accepted at the initial horse inspection, the horse may not participate in the Championship Training Session if it is held prior to the re-inspection. Horses not accepted at there-inspection will not be allowed to compete in the Championships. Horses may not participate in any concurrently held competition during which the Championship is held on the same grounds for a period of 48 hours following the horse inspection. (GR914.3)



B. Tack/ Equipment

USEF Rules: USEF rules will govern these Championships (JP 111). Additionally, please pay particular attention to the specifics listed below:

- 1. Martingales
 - Only running martingales used in a conventional manner are permitted in the PlatinumChampionships. (JP111.1b)
 - The use of any other type of martingale will be cause for elimination from that Championship class. Exception: Irish Martingales may be used.
- 2. Draw reins and German Martingales may only be used when schooling. No other headset devices (Chambon, etc.) are permitted in any class, and cable or metal tie downsare prohibited. (JP111.4) The use of Draw Reins is permissible during awards presentations and victory gallops
- 3. Boot Regulations. Refer to USEF rule JP 111.5.

Athlete Rules and Regulations

- 1. Although an athlete is not prevented from competing on another horse during the Championship week, there will be no waiting for that athlete during the Championship classes. If an athlete is not immediately available in the order, the athlete will be scratched from that Championship class.
- 2. For the order of go for classes with non-Platinum and Platinum horses entered, the Platinum horse must be ridden first.
- 3. Failure to enter the ring within one minute of being called incurs elimination. The time limit for entering the ring must be enforced by management. (JP137.2)
- 4. Only the competing athlete may be mounted on the Championship horse after the official horse inspection.
- 5. Riders' Meeting: There will be a **mandatory** riders' meeting and Show Jumping Athlete Pathway Orientation presentation. The time and location will be included in the prize listand schedule.
- 6. The draw for the Team Order of Go will take place at the Riders' Meeting. Teams will be determined two weeks prior to the Championship.

A. Schooling

• USEF Jumper Schooling Rules will be in effect *throughout the competition (JP 103)*.

B. Attire (JP111.9)

- 1. Official Horse Inspection and Course Walks
 - Athletes and designated representatives must be appropriately dressed during all championship activities. Athletes must wear boots, breeches, and a hard hat (exceptmeetings). A designated representative must be professionally dressed in proper footwear for the Official Horse Inspection.

2. First Individual and Team Competition

White breeches are required. Zone team shirts or team polo shirts are *encouraged*. Shirts must have collars and sleeves (sleeves may be either long or short) and must be tucked into breeches. Sleeveless shirts and shirts with exposed hoods are prohibited. If



team shirts are not available athletes must follow the *Formal Attire* dress code *(JP* 119.a). Members of each team must all wear coordinated attire. Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boot.

3. Individual Final

Formal Attire required. Dark, muted, or similar colored, coats are required; white breeches; a white tie, choker (unless the shirt, by design, has the choker built in for itsintended use) and a white shirt must be worn. Shirts must be fastened at the neck andtucked into breeches. Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the colormatches the paddock boots being worn. (JP111.9a)

MEDICATION RULES IV.

A. USEF Drugs & Medication rules will be in effect for these championships (GR 401-404).

V. **REQUIRED DOCUMENTS**

- A. Passports are not required.
- B. Entrants must comply with the documents and health certificates, if any, required by the organizer, state, and facility where the championship is being held.
- C. Current Coggins is required at the horse inspection.

VI. **CHAMPIONSHIP SCHEDULE**

There are two format options under which the Championships may be conducted. Host management may choose the option that they feel will work best for the Championship, always keeping the welfare of the horses and athletes as the primary consideration.

Championship Schedule

1.30/135m Junior/Amateur/Professional Championship; spreads up to 1.45m

- 1.40-1.45m Junior/Amateur/Professional Championship; spreads up to 1.55m
- The Speed Class and the Grand Prix are overlay competitions for the Platinum Championship Athlete/Horse Combinations. Championship ribbons will be given in addition to the show class awards and prize money.
- The speed is 350m/m.

OPTION ONE - Three Day/ Round Format

A. Day One (First Round of the Team Championship and First Individual Qualifying Class)

- 1. Specifications: The class will be conducted under Table II, Section 1. Faults and time. (JP) 146.2) The results of this class will be decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. Horses with clear rounds or equal faults are classified according to their time taken to complete the course. Athletes eliminated or retiring from the course for any reason shall receive a score equal to 20 faults more than the highest penalized competitor in that round *that completed the course* and received a score.
- 2. Individual Classification: Faults and time from Round One will be carried forward to the Individual Standings and into Round Two of the Team Championships on Day Two. Ties for non-medal positions in the Individual Final will be determined by the time taken on Day One.
- 3. Start Order: The draw for the team start order for the Team Championship will occur at the Riders' Meeting. The order of the individuals on a team will be determined by the Chefs and given to the USHJA representative at the Riders' Meeting. *Teams of three will*



start with their first rider in the second rotation.

- 4. Round One for the 1.30/1.35m Platinum Championship <u>may</u> be an overlay class with the horse show's regular 1.30m speed class. Table II.1
- 5. Round One for the 1.40/1.45m Platinum Championship <u>may</u> be an overlay class with the horse show's regular 1.40m speed class. Table II.1
- 6. All Platinum Championship competitors will go first in the start order of the Final Individual class if held as an overlay class.
- 7. Class Awards: Ribbons will be awarded through 8th place. Prize money: 20% of the sections prize money will be paid through 8th as follows: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 5%. This prize money is in addition to the prizemoney offered in the overlay class.
- B. Day Two (Second Round of the Team Championship/Second Individual Qualifying Class)
 - 1. Specifications: The Team Championship is a two round format held over two days. Round two also serves as the second Qualifying Class for the Individual Final. The competitors will be scored under a modified Table II.
 - 2. Scoring
 - The Second Round of the Team Championship is open only to athlete/horse combinations that have started (whether eliminated or not) in the First Individual Qualifying Class (Day One).
 - Athletes eliminated or retiring from the course for any reason shall receive a score equal to 20 faults more than that received by the highest penalized competitor in that
 - Only the *top* three scores of each team from *rounds one and two* will count toward the team's *final* score.
 - The winning team will be the team with the lowest combined scores from the two rounds.
 - Any teams tied for a medal shall jump off. The Chefs d'Equipe will select one member from their team for the jump off.
 - If jump-offs for multiple medals are required, the jump-off for the bronze medal will
 - Placing of teams tied below medal positions will be decided by the combined times from the three highest place riders on a team from Day One.
 - 3. Start Order: The starting order of teams will be the reverse order of team scores from the first round(Day One). Any teams tied will go in the order of their first round drawn order.
 - Athletes competing as individuals will compete in drawn order in the first round and first in the second round of the Team Competition. The second-round order for Individual competitors will be based on reverse order of scores from the first round.
 - 4. Class Awards: Medals will be awarded to the Gold, Silver and Bronze teams, ribbons will be awarded through 3rd place. Gold Teams must ride for ribbons, Silver and Bronze teams will enter the ring on foot for a podium presentation. Prize money: 15% of the sections prize money will be paid to the Gold, Silver and Bronze winning teams. Prize money will be paid through 3rd as follows: 50%, 30%, 20% and divided equally among the team members. Additionally, ribbons will be awarded through 8th to the individual class placings after round one and round two of team competition (Day two). Prize money: 15% of the sections Prize money will be paid through 8th to the individual; class placings (day two) as follows: 30%, 22%,15%,10%,7%,6%,5%,5%. Only faults from the second individual qualifier will be considered. Ties for individual placings will first be broken by the faults form the first round of Team Competition on day one. If ties remain, the time form day one will be used.



C. Day Three (Individual Final)

- 1. Specifications: The competition will conclude with the Individual Final on the third day. It will be scored under Table II Section 2 and held over one round. The top 15 athlete/horse combinations based on the cumulative scores from the first and second individual qualifying classes, including ties for 15th place, are eligible to compete. They must have not been eliminated in either of the two rounds of the competition. The list of the top 15 will be posted and distributed as soon as feasible after the Team Competition concludes and medals are awarded. Following this posting, if one or more of the qualified athlete/horse combinations is unable to start in the Individual Final, the combination will not be replaced.
- 2. The Individual Final for the 1.30/1.35m Platinum Championships may be an overlay with a Regional Standard Grand Prix Class. Individual Final Participants are eligible for prize money offered in the Championship as well as in the Grand Prix or featured classic if the overlay class is entered.
- 3. The Individual Final for the 1.40/1.45m Platinum Championships may be an overlay on the Grand Prix class. The horse show's Grand Prix or featured classic held at 1.40/1.45m, may serve as the Individual Final. Participants are eligible for prize money offered in the Championship as well as in the Grand Prix or featured classic if the overlay class is entered.
- 4. Start Order: The start order will be the reverse order of *a riders' total* scores incurred in the first and second individual qualifying classes. In the event of equality of scores, the result of the first qualifying class will decide, with a *lower placing* athlete/horse combination going before a *higher placing competitor*.
- 5. All athlete/horse combinations participating in the Platinum Championship will compete before non-Platinum athlete/horse combinations entered in the Grand Prix or featured classic.
- 6. Jump-Off: In the case of a tie for an individual medal, there will be a jump-off, with the jump-off going in the same order as in the Individual Final. Ties for medal position in the 1.30/1.35m or the 1.40/1.45m Platinum Championship will jump off before the Grand Prix jump off or featured classic.
- 7. Class Awards: Gold, Silver, and Bronze medals provided by the USHJA will be awarded to the top three individuals, along with ribbons to 8th and other specified prizes or prize money as may be specified by the organizers and the USHJA. Top <u>3</u> overall must ride for ribbons. Gold, Silver, and Bronze Individuals must stay for a podium presentation. The Individual Medal winners will be invited to participate in one of the USHJA Gold Star clinics. Please find the most update information about the USHJA Gold Star Clinic at. ushja.org/GoldStarClinics. Prizemoney: 50% of the sections prize money will be paid to winning individuals as follows: Gold – 50%, Silver – 30%, Bronze – 20%.

OPTION TWO – Four Day / Round Format

- A. Day One (First Individual Qualifying Class)
 - 1. Specifications: The class will be conducted under Table II, Section 1. Faults and Time (JP 146.2) Athletes eliminated or retiring for any reason will receive a score equal to 20 faults more than the highest penalized competitor in that round that completed the course and received a score.



- 2. Individual Classification: Faults from Round One will be carried forward to the Individual Standings. Faults from all rounds will be carried through to the Individual Final. *Ties for* non-medal positions in the Individual Final will be determined by the time taken on Day One.
- 3. Start Order: The order will be drawn at the Rider's Meeting.
- 4. The First Individual Qualifying class for the Platinum Championship may be an overlay class with the horse show's regular 1.40m speed class.
- 5. All Platinum Championship competitors will go first in the start order of the overlay classes and will compete in the order drawn at the Riders Meeting.
- 6. Class Awards: Ribbons will be awarded through 8th.
- 7. Prize money: 20% of the prize money for the section will be paid as follows: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 5%. Participants are eligible for prize money in the Championship as well as the overlay class.
- B. Day Two (*Round Two and Three* Team Championship and Second and Third Individual Qualifying Classes)
 - 1. Specifications: The Team Championship is a two round competition which also serves as the Second and Third Individual Qualifying classes for the Individual Final. This competition will be scored under a modified Table II over two identical rounds (JP 146.1)
 - 2. Scoring:
 - The Team Championship is open only to athlete/horse combinations that have started (whether eliminated or not) in the First Individual Qualifying Class (Day One).
 - All athletes will receive a score regardless of elimination and are eligible to compete in both rounds of the Team Championship.
 - Athletes eliminated or retiring from the round will receive a score equal to 20 faults more than the score of the highest penalized competitor in that round that completed the course and received a score.
 - Only the best three scores of each team from *rounds two and three* will count toward the team score.
 - The winning team will be the team with the lowest combined score from the two rounds.
 - Any teams tied for a medal position will jump off. The Chef d'Equipe will select one member *from* their team for the jump-off.
 - If multiple jump-offs are required, the jump-off for bronze will occur first.
 - Individual placing will be decided for the total scores from rounds two and three. Ties will be broken by day one placing.
 - 3. Start Order: The starting order of teams for the second round will be the reverse order of team scores from the first round of the Team Championship. Teams tied will start in thesame order as the first round.
 - Athletes competing as individuals will start first in the second round of the Team Championship. The second-round order for individuals will be based on reverse order of scores from the first round.
 - 4. Class Awards: Medals will be awarded to Gold, Silver and Bronze teams, ribbons awarded through3rd. Gold medal teams must ride for presentations, Silver and Bronze teams will enter the ring on foot for a podium presentation. Additionally, ribbons will be awarded 1st through 8th to the individual class placings from the combined scores from rounds one and



two of the Team Championship. Ties for individual placing will be broken by the faults and time from the First Individual Qualifying Class (Day One). Prize Money: 15% of the prize money for the section will be paid to the Gold, Silver and Bronze teams as follows: 50%, 30%, 20%. 15% of the prize money for the section will be paid to the top 8 individual class placings after round one and two the Team Championship as follows: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 5%.

C. Day Three (Mandatory Rest Day)

D. Day Four (Individual Final)

1. Specifications: The Individual Final will be scored under Table II, Section 2 and held over one round. The top 15 athlete/horse combinations based on cumulative scores for the first, second and third individual qualifying classes, including ties for 15th place are eligible to compete.

- They must not have been eliminate *d* in any of the three rounds of the competition. The list of the top 15 will be posted as soon as feasible following the conclusion of the Team Championship. If one or more of the qualified athlete/horse combinations are unable to start in the Individual Final, they will not be replaced.
- The Individual Final for the <u>1.30/1.35m</u> Platinum Championships <u>may</u> be an overlay on a <u>Regional Standard</u> Grand Prix class. The horse show's Grand Prix or featured classic held at the <u>1.30/1.35m</u>, <u>may</u> serve as the Individual Final.
- The Individual Final for the <u>1.40/1.45m</u> Platinum Championships <u>may</u> be an overlay on the Grand Prix class. The horse show's Grand Prix or featured classic held at the 1.40/1.45m, <u>may</u> serve as the Individual Final.
- 2. Start Order: The start order will be the reverse order of <u>a rider's</u> total score form the first, second and third individual qualifying classes. In the event of equality of score, the result of the First Individual Qualifying Class (Day One) will decide, with the lower placing starting before the higher placing.
- 3. All athlete/horse combinations participating in the Platinum Championship will compete before non-Platinum athlete/horse combinations entered in the Grand Prix or featured classic.
- 4. Jump-Off: In the case of a tie for an individual medal, there will be a jump-off, with the jump off going in the same order as in the individual final. Ties for medal position in the 1.30/1.35m or 1.40/1.45m Platinum Championship will jump off before the Grand Prix jump off or featured classic. If jump-offs for multiple medals are required, the jump-offfor the bronze medal will occur first.
- 5. Class Awards: Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be awarded to the top three individuals, and ribbons through8th. The top *3* must ride for awards. Medalists will stay for a podium presentation. Prize money: 50% of the prize money for the section will bepaid to the Gold, Silver and Bronze individual finalists as follows: 50%, 30%, 20%.
- 6. <u>Prize money awarded for the Championship will be in addition to any prize money won in the Grand Prix.</u>
- 7. The Individual Medal winners *are* invited to participate in one of the USHJA Gold Star clinics. *Wild Card applications will be considered*. Please find the most update information about the USHJA Gold Star Clinic at:ushja.org/GoldStarClinics.



- 1.10/1.15m Children's and Adult Amateur Jumper
- 1.20/1.25m Junior and Amateur Jumper
- 1.30/1.35m Junior and Amateur *Moved to the Platinum Jumper Championship*

I. MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- A. Eligible athletes must be a current active USEF and USHJA member in good standing (see GR201 & JP 100.1) from the time of application until conclusion of event.
- B. The horse must be registered with USHJA (see JP 100.2) and recorded with USEF pursuant to USEFGR 1102, in good standing under USEF rules.
- C. The burden of proof of eligibility to compete will rest with and be the sole responsibility of the owner or athlete, and not of the USHJA. USHJA staff is not available to determine each horse's athlete eligibility.
- D. The zone of each Athlete is determined by the athlete's point state as recorded with USEF as of December 1,2021. (See JP 100.5)
- E. Athletes wishing to participate in the USHJA Zone Jumper Team Championships complete and submit an application online at www.ushja.org/zonejumper no later than 45 days prior to the start of their respective Championship. The applicants must certify that they meet the qualification and eligibility conditions delineatedherein.
 - Application: December 1 through 45 days before each Combined Zone Championship. Fee of \$75 per athlete/horse combination. \$25 per additional athlete/horse combination applied.
- F. Refer to "Zone Eligibility Requirements" for important dates and deadlines.

II. OUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR ATHLETE/HORSE COMBINATIONS

- A. An athlete and/or horse is eligible to compete in only <u>one height section</u> and on <u>one team</u> at the Zone Jumper Team Championships:
 - 1.10/1.15m Children's and Adult Amateur Jumper Championships
 - 1.20/1.25m Junior and Amateur Jumper Championships
- B. In order to be eligible for the Zone Jumper Team Championships, *athlete/horse combination* must earn a minimum of 20 points in their respective section(s) at USEF licensed competitions held with fence heights of that section 45 days prior the start of their championship. *Exceptions: II.J.I Waivers at III.K Substitutions*.
- C. The point standings (ranking) in each zone <u>starts</u> 30 days following the conclusion of the previous year's Zone Jumper Team Championship to 45 days prior to the start of the current year's Championship, will be used to determine the <u>athlete/horse combination's</u> acceptance to compete in the *combined* zone's championships. *Exceptions: II.J.I Waivers and II.K Substitutions.*
- D. <u>Ties will be broken by the most first place finishes in qualifying classes, at their respective height. If ties still exist, the most second place finishes in qualifying classes at their respective height will be used and so on until the tie is broken.</u>
- E. Zone Jumper Team Championships must accept up to a maximum of 192 *athlete/horse combinations*. A maximum of eight teams per section will be accepted.
- F. <u>Any athlete</u> wishing to compete in the 1.10/1.15m Championship may not have competed, <u>on any horse</u>, in a class held at a height over 1.25m within the current qualifying period up through the championship.
- G. <u>Any athlete</u> wishing to compete in the 1.20/1.25m Junior/Amateur Jumper Championship may not have competed, <u>on any horse</u>, in a class held at a height over 1.35m within the qualifying period up throughthe championship.
- H. No athlete will be considered for the Zone Jumper Team Championship that has competed in classes that have heights greater than the maximum height restriction of each section in the current competition year unless a waiver has been granted.

- I. Waivers must be submitted at least 45 days prior to the championships. Any waivers submitted after the deadline will not be considered.
 - If an athlete has an extenuating circumstance and wishes to apply for a waiver to any of the requirements in Section I, he must apply to the USHJA explaining the circumstances and details. USHJA will appoint a group of jumper representatives that will evaluate the request and provide a final decision whether to accept or deny the waiver.
 - Waivers will not be granted for classes that do not meet the minimum fence height.
 - In no case will a waiver include any classes that occur less than 45 days before the Championship when the point standings freeze.
 - Waivers will not be granted for Athletes that have jumped over the maximum height restrictions more than 3 times within the qualifying period.

Substitutions

- 1. Once the definite entries are secured, and up to 14 days preceding the Monday of the Championship, if an eligible athlete/horse combination is unable to compete *in* the Championship, the space will be filled by the next available athlete/horse combination from the frozen point standings list.
- 2. After the 14-day deadline, if a horse is unable to compete and the athlete has another eligible horse, asubstitution will be allowed under the following conditions:
 - o If the qualifying points were won within 21 days of the championship, the athlete must present a copy of the official results from the qualifying horse shows showing the height of the class(s) and the placing of the horse.
 - The substituted horse must have earned its qualifying points with the athlete seeking the substitution.
 - o All substitutions must take place prior to the start of the horse inspection.
- 3. Once the first round of the competition commences, no changes in team composition will be allowed for any reason. If a three-member team is reduced to two, those riders will compete as individuals.
- 4. In a combined zone championship, at least three individuals from different zones may compete as a combined team, prior to the start of the first competition, upon approval from the USHJA Technical Delegate on site.
- 5. It is the intention of the USHJA to allow as much flexibility as possible within the parameters of sound, fair, friendly competition, and good sport in the allowance of teams to be combined at events should a competitor drop out due to sickness or injury.

K. Qualifying List

- Athlete/horse combinations for all three heights of the Zone Jumper Team Championships will be accepted from the USHJA Zone Jumper Team Championship Qualifying List (standings) found on the USHJA website, www.ushja.org/zonejumper.
- Combined Zones: Each Zone may send up to 16 qualified athlete/horse combinations per section. Should a Zone be unable to send 16 qualified athlete/horse combinations the other competing Zone may send more than their allotted 16 combinations until a maximum of 32 athlete/horse combinations per section have been accepted.
- Should the maximum number of 32 athlete/horse combinations not be met in any section an athlete may ask to be included in the Championship at the Zone Jumper Team Championship site. The athlete/horse combination must meet eligibility requirements and apply to the USHJA representative at the Championship competition 24 hours before the horse inspection. If a team is unavailable the additional athlete/horse combination will compete as an individual.

III. **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

Horse Rules and Regulations

- A. Horse inspection and jog for soundness
 - Championship horses must be stabled on the show grounds, in official horse show

- stabling, starting no later than 1 hour prior to the horse inspection and remaining onthe show grounds until the completion of their Championship.
- Horses competing in the Championship may not compete in any other class at the same horseshow after the Official Jog has taken place. *Exception: Official Zone Jumper Team Championship Training class if offered.*
- All Championship horses must be presented at the mandatory horse inspection by the athlete or designated representative. The horse inspection and jog for soundness will be held not more than 24 hours prior to the start of the First Individual Qualifying Class. The exact time and location will be included in the prize list and schedule for each championship.
- A designated representative other than the rider, who must be at least 18 years of age, may present at the horse inspection.
- Each horse must be presented with its entry number <u>and current Coggins</u>. Following the official <u>horse inspection</u>, the assigned back number must always accompany the horse when it is out of its stall and must be visible on the stall door when in the stall.
- Horses not accepted at the horse inspection and jog for soundness will have the opportunity to be re-presented once prior to the First Individual Qualifying Class.
- If a horse is not accepted at the initial horse inspection and jog for soundness, they may not participate in the Championship Training Session if it is held prior to the re-inspection. Horses not accepted at the re-inspection and jog for soundness will not be allowed to compete in the Championships. Horses may not participate in any concurrently held competition during which the Championship is held on the same grounds for a period of 48hours following the horse inspection. (GR914.3)

B. Tack/Equipment

USEF Rules: USEF rules will govern these Championships. (JP 111). Additionally, please pay particular attention to the specifics listed below:

- Martingales
 - Standing martingales are permitted in the 1.10/1.15m Children's and Adult Amateur Jumper Championship and the 1.20/1.25m Junior and Amateur Jumper Championships
 - o The use of any other type of martingale will be cause for elimination from that Championship class. Exception: Irish Martingales may be used.
- The use of Draw Reins, German Martingales, Chambons, or any other unconventional equipment are not allowed at any time during the Championships, including schooling. Exception: The use of Draw Reins is permissible during Awards Presentations and Victory Gallops.
- Equipment
 - o Boot regulations-Refer to rule JP111.5.

Athlete Rules and Regulations

- 1. Although an athlete is not prevented from competing on another horse during the Championship week, there will be no waiting for that athlete/horse during the Championship classes. If an athlete is not immediately available in the order, the athlete will be scratched from that Championship class.
- 2. Failure to enter the ring within one minute of being called incurs elimination. The time limit for entering the ring must be enforced by management. (JP136.2)
- 3. Only the competing athlete may be mounted on the Championship horse after the official jog.
- 4. Rider's Meeting: There will be a **mandatory** rider's meeting and Show Jumping Athlete Pathway Orientation presentation: time and location will be included in the prize list and schedule.
- 5. The draw for the Team Order of Go *may* take place at the Riders Meeting.

- 6. Teams will be determined two weeks prior to the Championship and are subject to change should a member of a team scratch. All necessary changes will be communicated to the Zone Chefs d'Equipe.
- 7. To hold a Zone Jumper Team Championship, a minimum of three teams must be entered in each section or combined section. Teams may be combined by sections or height, and/or combined section, height, and zone.
- A. Schooling
 - USEF Jumper Schooling Rules will be in effect throughout the competition (JP 103) and Appendix A
- B. Attire (JP111.9)
 - 1. Official Horse Inspection and Jog for Soundness and Course Walks
 - Athletes and or designated representatives must be appropriately dressed. Athletes must wear boots, breeches, and a hard hat. A designated representative must be professionally dressed in proper footwear for the Official Horse Inspection and Jog for Soundness, *Please refer to USEF rule JP* 111.9c
 - 2. First Individual Qualifier and Team Competition
 - White breeches: Zone team shirts are *encouraged*. Shirts must havecollars and sleeves (sleeves may be either long or short) and must be tucked into breeches. Sleeveless shirts and shirts with exposed hoods are prohibited. If team shirts are not available athletes must follow the *Formal Attire* dress code. (JP 111.9a)
 - Members on each team must all wear coordinated shirts or formal attire. Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted *if* the color matches the paddock boot.
 - Individual Final 3.
 - Formal Attire required. Dark, muted, or similar colored, coats are required; white breeches; a white tie, choker (unless the shirt, by design, has the choker built in for its intended use) and a white shirt must be worn. Shirts must be fastened at the neck and tucked into breeches. Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted *if* the color matches the paddock boots being worn. (JP111.9a)

IV. **MEDICATION RULES**

C.

A. USEF Drugs & Medication rules will be in effect for these championships (GR 401-404)

REOUIRED DOCUMENTS V.

- A. Passports are not required.
- B. Entrants must comply with the documents and health certificates, if any, required by the organizer, state, and facility where the championship is being held.
- Current Coggins are required at the horse inspection.

VI. CHAMPIONSHIP SCHEDULE

There are two format options under which the Championships may be conducted. Host management may choose the option that they feel will work best for the Championship, always keeping the welfare of the horses and athletes as the primary consideration.

Championship Schedule for all height sections

- 1. 1.10-1.15m Children's and Adult Amateur Championship; spreads up to 1.25m
- 2. 1.20-1.25m Junior and Amateur Championship; spreads up to 1.40m
- 3. The speed for all three height sections is 350m/m.

OPTION ONE – Three Day / Three Round Format

A. Day One (First Round of the Team Championship and First Individual Qualifying Class)

Specifications: The class will be conducted under Table II, Section 1. Faults and Time. (JP 1. 146.2) The results of this class will be decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time allowed. Horses with clear rounds or equal faults are classified according to their time taken to complete the course. Athletes eliminated

- or retiring from the course, for any reason, shall receive 20 faults more than the highest penalized competitor in that round who completed the course and received a score.
- 2. Individual Classification: Faults *and time* from Round One will be carried forward to the Individual Standings.
- 3. The order of the individuals on a team will be determined by the Chefs and given to the USHJA representative at the Rider's Meeting. Teams of three will start with their first rider in the second rotation.

4.Only the top three team member scores from Round One will count toward the team score on Round Two.

5. Class Awards: Ribbons will be awarded through 8th place. Prize money: 20% of the sections prize money will be paid through 8th as follows: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 5%.

B. Day Two (Second Round of the Team Championship/Second Individual Qualifying Class)

- Specifications: The Team Championship is a two-round format held over two days. Round two also serves as the second Qualifying Class for the Individual Final. The competitors will be scored under modified Table II.
- Scoring
 - o The Second Round of the Team Championship is open only to athlete/horse combinations that have started (whether eliminated or not) in the First Individual Qualifying Class (Day
 - o Athletes eliminated or retiring from the course for any reason shall receive a score equal to 20 faults more than that received by the highest penalized competitor in that round.
 - o Only the *top* three scores of each team from **rounds one and two** will count toward the team's final score.
 - o The winning team will be the team with the lowest combined scores from the two rounds.
 - Any teams tied for a medal shall jump off. The Chefs d'Equipe will select one member from the team for the jump-off.
 - o If jump-offs for multiple medals are required, the jump-off for the lowest medal will occur first.
 - Placing of teams tied below medal positions will be decided by the combined times from the three highest place riders on a team from Day One.
- Start Order: The starting order of teams will be the reverse order of team scores from the first round (Day One). Any teams tied will go in the order of their first-round drawn order.
- o Athletes competing as individuals will compete in drawn order in the first round and first in the second round of the Team Competition. The second-round order for Individual competitors will be based on the reverse order of scores from the first round.
- Class Awards: Medals will be awarded to the gold, silver, and bronze teams, ribbons will be awarded through 3rd place, along with any trophy or other prizes that management chooses to award. Gold team must ride for ribbons, silver and bronze teams will enter the ring on foot for a podium presentation. Prize money: 15% of the section's prize money will be paid to the Gold, Silver, and Bronze winning teams. Prize money will be paid through 3rd as follows: 50%, 30%, 20% and divided equally among the team's members. Additionally, ribbons will be awarded through 8th to the individual class placings after round one and round two of the Team Competition. Prizemoney: 15% of the section's prize money will be paid through 8th to the individual class placings. After round two of *the Individual Qualifier* follows: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 5%. Only faults from the 2nd Individual Qualifier will be considered. Ties for individual placing will be broken by the time from Day One.

C. Day Three (Individual Final)

Specifications: The competition will conclude with the Individual Final on the third day. It will be scored under Table II Section 2 and held over one round. The top 15 athlete/horse combinations

based on the cumulative scores from the first and second individual qualifying classes, including ties for 15th place, are eligible to compete. They must have not been eliminated in either of the two rounds of the competition. The list of the top 15 will be posted and distributed as soon as feasible after the Team Competition concludes and medals are awarded. Following this posting, if one or more of the qualified athlete/horse combinations is unable to start in the Individual Final, the combination will not be replaced.

- Start Order: The start order will be the reverse order of a rider's total scores incurred in the first and second individual qualifying classes. In the event of equality of scores, the result of the first qualifying class will decide, with a *lower placing* athlete/horse combination going before a higher placing competitor.
- Jump-Off: In the case of a tie for an individual medal, there will be a jump-off. Competitors will jump off in the same *start* order of the Individual Final. *If jump-offs for multiple medals* are required, the jump-off for the bronze medal will occur first.
- Class Awards: Gold, Silver, and Bronze medals provided by the USHJA will be awarded to the top three individuals, along with ribbons to 8th and other specified prizes or prize money as may be specified by the organizers and the USHJA. Top 3 overall must ride for ribbons. Gold. Silver, and Bronze Individuals must stay for a podium presentation. Prize money: 50% of the sections prize money will be paid to medal winning individuals as follows: Gold – 50%, Silver -30%, Bronze -20%.
- The Individual Medalists *are* invited to participate in one of the USHJA Gold Star clinics. WildCard applications will be considered. Please find the most updated information about the USHJA Gold Star clinics at: ushja.org/GoldStarClinics.

OPTION TWO – Four Day / Four Round Format

A. Day One (*Round One*-First Individual Qualifying Class)

- Specifications: The class will be conducted under Table II, Section 1. Faults and Time (JP 146. 2) Athletes eliminated or retiring for any reason will receive 20 faults more than the highest penalized competitor in that round that completed the course and received a score.
- Individual Classification: Faults from Round One will be carried forward to the Individual Standings. Faults from all rounds will be carried through to the Individual Final. Ties for non-medal positions in the Individual Final will be determined by the time taken on Day One.
- Start Order: The order will be drawn at the Rider's Meeting.
- Class Awards: Ribbons will be awarded through 8th.
- Prize money: 20% of the prize money for the section will be paid as follows: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%,5%,5%.

B. Day Two (*Round Two and Three* Team Championship and Second and Third Individual Qualifying Classes)

- Specifications: The Team Championship is a two-round competition which also serves as the Second and Third Individual Qualifying classes for the Individual Final. This competition will be cored under a modified Table II over two identical rounds.
- Scoring:
 - The Team Championship is open only to athlete/horse combinations that have started(whether eliminated or not) in the First Individual Qualifying Class (Day One).
 - All athletes will receive a score regardless of elimination and are eligible to compete in both rounds of the Team Championship.
 - Athletes eliminated or retiring from the round will receive 20 faults more than the score of the highest penalized competitor in that round that completed the course and received a score.
 - Only the best three scores of each team from Rounds *One and Two of the Team Competition* will count toward the team score.

- o The winning team will be the team with the lowest combined score from the two rounds.
- Any teams tied for a medal position will jump off. The Chef d'Equipe will select one member <u>from</u> the<u>ir</u> team for the jump-off. If multiple jump-offs are required, the jump-off for bronze will occur first.
- o <u>Individual placing will be decided from the combined scores of Rounds Two and Three.</u> <u>Ties will be broken by day one placing.</u>
- Start Order: The first-round team order will be drawn at the rider's meeting. The order of the riders on the team will be decided by the Chef d'Equipe.
- The starting order of teams *for the second round* will be the reverse order of team scores from the first round of the Team Championship. Teams tied will start in the same orderas the first round.
 - O Athletes competing as individuals will start <u>in drawn order in the</u> first <u>round</u>, <u>and first in</u> the second round of the Team Championship. The second-round order for individuals will be based on the reverse order of scores from the first round.
 - Oclass Awards: Medals will be awarded to Gold, Silver and Bronze teams, ribbons awarded through 3rd. Gold medal teams must ride for presentations, Silver and Bronze teams will enter the ring on foot for a podium presentation. Additionally, ribbons will be awarded 1st through 8th to the individual class placings from the combined scores from rounds one and two of the Team Championship. Ties for individual placing will be broken by the times from the First Individual Qualifying Class (Day One).


• Prize Money:

- <u>Teams</u>: 15% of the prize money for the section will be paid to the Gold, Silver, and Bronze teams as follows: 50%, 30%, 20%.
- <u>Second Individual Qualifier:</u> 15% of the prize money for the section will be paid to the top 8 individual class placings after round one and two the Team Championship as follows: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%,5%, 5%.

C. Day Four (Individual Final)

- Specifications: The Individual Final will be scored under Table II, Section 2 and held over one round. The top 15 athlete/horse combinations based on cumulative scores for the first, second and third individual qualifying classes, including ties for 15th place are eligible to compete. They must not have been eliminate <u>d</u> in any of the three rounds of the competition. The list of the top 15 will be posted as soon as feasible following the conclusion of the Team Championship. If one or more of the qualified athlete/horse combinations are unable tostart in the Individual Final, they will not be replaced.
- Start Order: The start order will be the reverse order of <u>a rider's</u> total score from the first, second and third individual qualifying classes. In the event of equality of score, the result of the First Individual Qualifying Class (Day One) will decide, with the lower placing starting before the higher placing.
- Jump-Off: In the case of a tie for an individual medal, there will be a jump-off, with the jump off going in the same order as in the individual final. <u>If jump-offs for multiple</u> medals are required, the jump-off for the bronze medal will occur first.
- Class awards: Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be awarded to the top three individuals, and ribbons through 8th. The top <u>3</u> must ride for awards. The medalist will stayfor the podium presentation.
- Prize money: 50% of the prize money for the section will be paid to the Gold, Silver and Bronze individual winners as follows: 50%, 30%, 20%. *Ties for non-medal placings willbe determined by Day One times.*

GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS

GOVERNING RULES:

USEF: This competition is governed and approved by the United States Equestrian Federation. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. To the extent there is a conflict between the prize list and the USEF rules, USEF rules will prevail.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR218) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

REMINDER: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

COMPETITION AND STALL/ ENTRY DATES:

Stall reservations and entries MUST now be made separately. Stall reservations, entries, and document signatures are required to be submitted by the following dates for the respective competitions. Reservations and entries not received by these dates will still be allowed, subject to availability, but may be subject to a late fee. Exhibitors and trainers are advised that individual show weeks may sell out, even prior to the deadline date below:

OTHER AFFILIATE ORGANIZATIONS: From time to time, Desert International Horse Park (DIHP) will run classes sanctioned by additional affiliate organizations. These classes, and any fees collected by DIHP on behalf of the affiliate organizations, if any, have received the appropriate approval and documentation by the USEF. At the present time, these affiliate organizations may include California Professional Horseman Association (CPHA), Pacific Coast Horseshow Association (PCHA), SCHSA.

GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS

Exhibitors are responsible for knowledge of the Rules and Regulations governing the horse show and for their own errors and omissions. In the case of a violation of a cross entry restriction, the exhibitor will forfeit the entry fee, class placing and prize money award.

COVID - 19

DIHP will adhere to any and all COVID protocols as required by USEF, FEI, State of California and Riverside County in place at the time of the show. All individuals entering the horse park must abide by these requirements.

AGREEMENTS AND DOCUMENTS:

USEF ENTRY AGREEMENT By entering a Federationlicensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the Desert Circuit competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR 908.4. The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges; to change specifications in Jumper classes as competition warrants. Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Show Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s), or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

In the event of a cancellation due to severe weather or other emergency, refunds of entry fees must be made upon request by the exhibitor within 30 days of the cancellation.

USEF WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY. ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND IDEMNITY AGREEMENT:

Effective immediately, all individuals on the property will be required to sign the USEF Waiver and Release of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Idemnity Agreement. The Agreement will be available on our website (www.deserthorsepark.com) and can be executed and signed electronically.

DIHP GENERAL LIABILITY AGREEMENT: All individuals on the property, whether or not they are competing, will be required to sign a general liability agreement. The agreement will be available on the DIHP website and can be executed electronically.

CONTACT AND EMERGENCY HEALTH INFORMATION:

All individuals on the property are required to provide contact information for themselves and their emergency contact. This information will be used, as needed, to support the County of Riverside Environmental Health contact tracing program. The required information is available on the DIHP website.

SPECTATORS: Spectators will be allowed at the Desert International Horse Park this season, unless a change in rules by FEI, USEF, the State of California, and/or the County of Riverside. Please check our website to the latest update on rules.

SIGNATURES ON DOCUMENTS: Signatures on documents are required to be made by the actual individual. Signatures by others will not be accepted. Electronic

signatures will be allowed.

ENTRIES, FEES, AND PAYMENT:

ENTRIES: Entries will only be accepted on line on the DIHP website through the showgroundslive show management system. There will be a \$350 non refundable deposit per horse per week. Entries must be received by the deadline posted above. Entries received after the posted deadline will be late and will be charged a late entry fee. Online entry forms must be completed in their entirety. Incomplete forms will not be accepted and will be considered a late entry, subject to a late entry fee. Classes may only be entered or declared by using a Class Number.

PAYMENTS: Fees must be paid in U.S. funds. Checks drawn on Canadian banks must be pre printed by a financial institution with the legend "U.S. Funds" and drawn on a U.S. bank. Visa, Master Card, & American Express are accepted. Customers paying by credit card will have an additional 3% processing fee. Payment information must be provided at time of entry. Full payment is required at the end of each week of competition. No balances may be rolled forward to the following week. Exhibitors and trainers who have not settled accounts prior to the beginning of the next week of competition will not be allowed to compete. Exhibitors and trainers may close out and make payment on-line. Management has permission to close out any outstanding balances with payment information provided. Stabling, nominating, and administration fees will not be refunded under any circumstances. Trainers will be held financially responsible for any clients who do not submit viable payment in a timely manner, including late fees. Accounts with returned checks/declined credit cards/ disputed charges will be assessed a penalty of the greater of \$50 or 10 percent of the face value of the declined amount.

COMPETITION FEES: Each horse will be charged a USEF fee of \$23 per competition (\$15 Drugs and Medication, \$8 USEF), a \$14 fee to CDFA for Drug Screening, and a non refundable \$7 fee for USHJA. Anyone who is not a member of USEF and/or USHJA will be charged a \$45 show pass fee by USEF and a \$30 show pass fee by USHJA. All horses competing in any USEF Computer Ranked Grand Prix at DIHP are subject to USEF International High-Performance fee in accordance with GR207. DIHP assess a fee of \$35 per horse for participation. FEI horses will pay the \$33 FEI Horse Fee.

OFFICE FEES: A fee of \$135 will be charged to each horse for each week of competition. This is the only per horse fee charged by DIHP. This fee includes medical personnel and emergency response, Showgroundslive, security, and office support. It also includes video streaming.

OTHER FEES: An additional fee of \$100 will be charged for entries received after the closing date, show scratch, nonshowing, failure to close out an account within 24 hours of the competition ending, and missing information on an entry. Horses stabling in season stalls will not be charged weekly

late entry or weekly scratch fees for changing the weeks the horse is showing. A \$50 per week fee will be added to any horse not purchasing shavings from DIHP for manure management, removal, and disposal. A \$50 fee per class will be added for a rider who competes in a class but failed to enter correctly.

BACK NUMBERS: One back number per horse will be assigned at each DIHP circuit. As per GR908.2, a signature is required on each entry blank for each rider that rides that horse. This signature is the sole responsibility of the rider. Those found riding an entry while displaying a back number assigned to others from DIHP, without having the new rider's signature attached to that entry, assuring the owner's consent to rider, as well as agreeing to all of the rules of the competition and the Federation, will be considered in noncompliance as described in GR908.3 and will be disqualified from the class and competition until a proper entry blank is signed. Back numbers must be worn by the horse with the corresponding microchip number. All horses on the property will be required to have a back number and be registered at the office as a showing horse.

FOREIGN EXHIBITOR ASSOCIATION REQUIREMENTS:

Owners, riders, and trainers, must provide an electronic copy (English) that they are a member in good standing of their national federation. Riders showing in classes restricted to Junior, Amateur, or Adults must present their membership card or other documentation indicating their Junior or Amateur status. Amateurs must provide or sign for USEF Amateur Status. Foreign Amateur riders must join USEF and sign for Amateur Status. Members of EC must sign for Amateur Status but are not required to join USEF.

HORSE/PONY MEASUREMENT CARD: Horse/ponies showing in Junior Hunter, Pony Hunter, Children's Pony Hunter or Pony Jumper are required to have a USEF Measurement card or arrange to be measured at the show. Foreign measurement cards are not acceptable as proof of measurement.

USEF HORSE RECORDING: Horse must be recorded with USEF annually or for Life in order to be eligible for HOTY Awards and/or Zone Awards.

USHJA HORSE REGISTRATION: All horses competing in USEF licensed Hunter/Jumper/Eq competitions must have or obtain a Registration Number from UHSJA.

MICROCHIPS: All horses/ponies required to have a USHJA number must have a microchip. This number must be recorded with USHJA.

OPPORTUNITY CLASSES: All opportunity classes will be held in accordance with GR821. Riders entered only in these classes are exempt from the Federation membership requirements and are not required to pay a nonmember fee

but are required to list the Federation membership number if the participant is a member.

ADD/SCRATCH/CHANGE: Any class add/scratch/change must be made on ShowGroundslive through the DIHP website by 4 pm on the day before the class is scheduled to run. Class fees will be charged to horses entered at 4PM.

NO DAY OF ADDS: Any exhibitor who does not compete in a class in which he/she is officially entered, and does not scratch according to the Scratch Procedures, will be billed for the class. The horse show policies herein stated regarding scratches and refunds will be followed regardless of weather and in place of GR 912. Once a class or division begins, it may not be scratched, except for a Vet Scratch. If a Vet Scratch, the horse must be scratched electronically through showgroundslive on the DIHP website. The Official Show Vet's Certificate in the Show Office on the day of the class and the Official Show Vet's Certificate must be received electronically by the end of the competition day and a scratch fee will still apply. A class that has been closed may not be scratched.

STALLS: The following rules will be in place for stalls. Failure to comply with stall rules will result in loss of stall usage with no refund.

- 1) Stalls are not transferable and use is limited to horses entered under the trainer's name who rented the stall 2) Access to a barn/tent is limited to trainers/owners/
- employees of stall/ barn rented
- 3) Strict adherence to DIHP biosecurity rules 4) Curfew and quiet times must be observed between

11pm and 5 am

PARKING/VEHICLE ACCESS: Parking is allowed in designated areas only. Vehicles parking in No Parking areas will be towed at owner's expense. DIHP is not responsible for damage to vehicles under tow. Vehicles are not allowed in the "NO ACCESS AREA" during competition, defined as Wednesday to Sunday from 4:30 am to 5:00 pm. Vehicles parked in the "NO ACCESS AREA" will be towed.

RESERVED PARKING: Reserved parking will be available Wednesday to Sunday of each competition week. Weekly passes will enable the pass holder to have a designated stall. The passes will be available on a firstcome, first-serve basis on the DIHP website. The fee for a weekly pass will be \$200 per week. Reservations will need to be made each week.

SHUTTLE SERVICE: DIHP will operate a free shuttle service around the horse park and between the barns/ tents and the parking areas.

DIHP ID BADGES AND GENERAL LIABILITY AGREEMENT: All individuals on the property, whether or not they are competing are required to obtain a photo ID and sign the DIHP general liability agreement. The application for a photo ID and the general liability agreement can be found on the DIHP website. Photos may be submitted in

advance and ID badges may be picked up at the show office during regular hours.

SHOW OFFICE:

HOURS: The DIHP show office is open from 7:00 am to 4:30 pm each day. All transactions can be made on-line by accessing showgroundslive on our website. Assistance will be provided at the outside windows at the show office. Access to the inside of the office will be limited.

BRAIDING: Braiding is optional and horses that are not braided will not not be penalized.

TRAINER SPLITS: DIHP allows trainers to split the show charges for miscellaneous items to their clients. Splits will be accepted until noon on the Friday of a show week. No exceptions will be made. Only items billed by the horse show directly can be split. Splits will revert back to the trainer for payment if uncollected.

DAILY SCHEDULE: Entries for the next day must be completed by 4 pm the day before through showgroundslive on the DIHP website. The final ring schedule will be available at approximately 7 pm for order of go sign ups. Order of go for the Grand Prix ring and medal classes will be provided by the office. Exhibitors in classes without an office provided order of go may sign up for a slot until midnight. Notices for all of these deadlines will be sent daily on the DIHP texting service.

COMBINING, DIVIDING, OR CANCELING DIVISIONS, CLASSES, OR CLASSICS: All decisions to combine, divide, or cancel classes, divisions, or classics will be made in accordance with USEF, USHJA and other relevant affiliates rules and posted on the daily schedule on showgroundslive available on the DIHP website.

TEXTING SERVICE: Individuals can sign up to receive daily text messages on the DIHP schedule by texting 'DIHP' to 474747. Message and data rates may apply.

GOLF CART RENTALS: Golf carts may be rented at DIHP for individual use. All of the golf carts are gas powered. All golf carts will be cleaned prior to customer acceptance. Customers are responsible for cleaning their golf carts during the rental period. Golf cart rental reservations may be made at www.deverrentals.com.

PRIZE MONEY: Prize Money will be issued to the "Recipient of Prize Money" recorded on the entry within 30 days of the close of competition, thereby ending the show's responsibility as long as all criteria has been met. A valid Social Security or Federal ID number and valid address must be provided in addition to a W-9. Prize money checks will be mailed to the prize money recipient at the address on the entry blank within thirty days after the show. With advance permission from the show office, prize money may be credited to the entry's show account after the results of the class winnings are posted. If all proper tax information is not provided, the prize money will be withheld until it is provided. Classes that

do not have enough entries to pay out prize money will either be cancelled, or run without prize money at the exhibitors' option. Add Back Prize Money is computed from the number of horses that actually show. Horses entered but not shown forfeit the add back money.

Please be advised that prize money won by foreign exhibitors is subject to the US Internal Revenue Service regulation requiring sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money. Foreign exhibitors should apply for a Social Security number and will be asked to complete Form W-8BEN prior to receiving prize money.

FACILITY INFORMATION:

Footing in the competition and warm-up areas at the Desert International Horse Park in Thermal, California is all-weather and grass. Ring sizes are posted below and may change from show week to show week. Notice will be posted on-line at the DIHP website.

DRONES: The operation of drones at the horse park is strictly prohibited. This includes drones operated from within the horse park property as well as operated from outside the horse park boundaries and flown over the horse park property.

FOOD SERVICE:

VIP PAVILION: The VIP Pavilion overlooks the Grand Prix Arena and the Main Hunter Arena. VIP tables are available for seating of 8, 6 or 4 people. VIP is open for coffee service and breakfast starting at 7:00 am Wednesday to Sunday of each competition week. Lunch and snacks are served until 5:00 pm each day or until competition ends. Dinner is provide most Friday and Saturday evenings. Food service is provided in the main seating area as well as the assisted serving area accessed through the glass doors on the east end of the pavilion. Prices for VIP will be posted on the DIHP website and reservations can be made by emailing VIP@deserthorsepark. com. When competition is scheduled on the grass field, VIP will also be available by the side of the grass field.

DIHP FOOD PAVILION: DIHP will offer a range of food outlets at the horse park, both at the new food pavilion by Jumper 2 and by the Parlanti bar. The food pavilion will include tables and lounge furniture under a new tent on the east side of Jumper 2. Food will be provided starting at 7 am Tuesday through Sunday. A food outlet will also be set up behind permanent barn 5.

COFFEE: Koffie Vielo will provide coffee service at their trailer located on the east side of the Grand Eq arena, next to the DIHP store.

STABLING, PADDOCKS AND TRAILERING IN:

STABLING: DIHP offers a range of stabling options for competitions. There are two types of buildings, permanent barns with 12x12 stalls and clear span tents with 12x12 stalls. A limited number of private barns are available for lease on a long-term basis, with and without rings. All stalls include mats. Stalls may be reserved on a weekly basis during the 2022/2023 season. Weekly stalls enable us to maintain the flexibility to meet the needs of as many customers as possible intending to come to the horse park. We recognize that many customers plan to come to the horse park for extended times. For those interested in solutions that best meet their unique needs for the season, including passes for the season or circuit, please reach out to us at info@deserthorsepark.com so that we can put together a package. Custom packages must be arranged prior to September 15. Stalls are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. We cannot guarantee you will receive your preferred stabling choice. Move-in is allowed on Monday of each competition week at any time after noon. Move-out must be by Sunday at 8 pm. If you need other accommodations for move-in or move-out, please contact the DIHP office staff at stabling@deserthorsepark.com. Bedding on stall is prohibited except when the horse's health is at issue. Please obtain prior approval from the DIHP office staff at stabling@deserthorsepark.com. A clean-up fee may apply.

MATS: Mats are now provided in all permanent and clear span tents.

FEED STORE: DIHP operates a full-service feed and bedding store. This season the feed store will offer multiple brands for both feed and supplements as well as a variety of hay options. All orders must be made on-line on the DIHP website. Prices for feed, shavings, supplements, and hay are posted on-line. Third party deliveries are not allowed. Individuals bringing their own bedding may do so but may only access the barns when competition access and parking restrictions are not in place.

BARN OFFICES: Barn offices are available for rent during the season. There are two offices located in each permanent barn. Please email: jess@deserthorsepark.com for information.

PADDOCKS: DIHP has 50 paddocks which are of metal construction and are separated on all four sides by walkways. They are roughly (50' x 75') in size and each has its own gate. Exhibitors are encouraged to bring their own locks to secure their reserved paddocks. Paddocks are NOT to be used for overnight turnout. Paddock reservations may be made on the DIHP website at www.deserthorsepark.com using our new Paddock reservation system. Preferences for location will be honored to the extent possible. Reservations are for a week at a time, Monday at noon to Monday at noon, and the price is posted on-line.

GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS

DAILY HAUL IN: Daily haul ins may be allowed in a designated space in the trailer parking area subject to new bio security rules. Electricity and water are not provided. Haul in customers are required to provide all needs to ensure the safety of their horses. Daily inspections will be made by DIHP/USEF to ensure horses are adequately cared for. The fee for haul ins will be \$150/horse/week. All horses hauling in must have a number and be registered in the horse show office.

SAFETY, HEALTH & VETERINARY:

SHARPS AND MEDICAL WASTE: In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, BioHazardous Medical Waste Containers will be provided in the stable area. Sharps & Medical Waste must be placed in the proper receptacles. Anyone found discarding sharps or medical waste in any other manner will be fined up to \$250 per instance and be responsible for any fines and expenses incurred by management.

SHOW VETERINARIAN: Show Veterinarian is in residence on the show grounds. The Vet's phone number will be posted on line and at the Show Office.

FARRIER: Farrier is available on the show grounds during all competition days in accordance with GR1211.5.

EQUINE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: Equine Health Requirements will be enforced. All horses (competing or not) that enter the grounds are required to present the Required Health Entry Requirements, including the Event Participation Declaration and Proof of Vaccination. All horses are subject to examination by DIHP officials/designated representatives and/or state officials (collectively "officials") for determining whether such animals are, have been infected/exposed, or are likely to become infected with an infectious or contagious disease. If after such examination, officials have reason to believe that an animal's health condition places other animals at risk, such officials, at their sole discretion, may quarantine such animal (and others that may have been infected/exposed) or, if appropriate, require that such animals be transported off the grounds. All participants agree to fully cooperate with event officials and abide by their decisions and instructions. Failure to comply shall be grounds for immediate expulsion and potential disciplinary action by organization, state/local or federal animal health officials. All exhibitors are encouraged to review the equine health entry/transport requirements of the destination state prior to entry. Additional information can be obtained from the State Vet Office. New biosecurity rules will be announced shortly.

POLING, LUNGEING AND OFFSETS: Manual poling and the use of bamboo offsets are prohibited for all horses competing at DIHP pursuant GR844. Any rider, trainer, groom or any other person who is in violation of the rules set forth above will be fined \$500 for each incident and may be suspended from further competition. Any horse upon which a violation of the manual poling and/or use of bamboo off-sets rule will be suspended from competition. Lungeing is only allowed in designated areas.

HORSE WATCH: Barns/trainers may purchase night watch services for horses stabled on the show grounds through one of two vendors operating on the premises

SAFETY: Accidents Involving Competitors. GR1317. In the event of a head injury due to a fall/accident at a licensed competition, the competitor may be prohibited from further competition until released by medical personnel. In some cases, the competitor may not return to competition without a signed release from a licensed medical professional. The competitor may be placed on suspension by USEF until a release is provided. Competitors are advised to familiarize themselves with this rule.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes, when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee and Licensed Official are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance, GR 801.2.7.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES AND GOLF CARTS: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are

exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. Only motorized vehicles in proper working condition are allowed to operate on property. ANY vehicle without proper headlights is not allowed to operate before sunrise and after sunset.

DOGS: Dogs must be restrained on the show grounds. Loose dogs will be picked up and detained and the owner fined \$100. The owner may be barred from showing and expelled from the show grounds for a second offense, or for refusal to pay the fine, and will not be entitled to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due. Management reserves the right to call Animal Control to have an animal removed from the premises. GR 1301.6

FACILITY:

RV SPACES: DIHP has 230 individual RV spaces available for weekly rentals. The RV spaces include sewer, water, and electrical hook ups. RV space reservations may be made on the new RV reservation system on the DIHP website. The fee for RV spaces is \$425/week and \$200/non show weeks and payment can be made directly on line. DIHP will attempt as best possible to honor location preferences. Assistance on additional RV needs is available through our partners at C3RV LLC (855-331-C3RV) and Star RV and Trailer Rentals (951-445-6447). Seasonal RV Passes may be purchased for \$6,500 and covers an RV Space from October through March. Seasonal Passes must be paid in full by the end of National Sunshine Series Week I. RV passes are non refundable!

ELECTRICAL/FIRE REGULATIONS: Electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles shall be maintained clear for a minimum of six feet wide by eight feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in these aisles. No Class I Flammable Liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse show without recourse. Additional appliances are not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to confiscation of the item(s).

TENT MODIFICATIONS: Exterior Tent alterations are strictly forbidden. The removal of stall tent side poles, side ropes and/or stakes/anchors is strictly prohibited. Any exhibitor found in violation will be issued a single warning. If

violation continues, Management reserves the right to remove from the show grounds all property belonging to or under the control of said violator. Further, Management reserves the right to bar any exhibitor found to be in violation from any further participation in the horse show without recourse to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due.

DAMAGE: Owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly.

ADHERENCE TO THE RULES: All individuals on the horse park property are required to adhere to the rules mentioned in the prize list or as directed by the employees at the horse park. Trainers are all responsible for employees adhering to the rules. Violations will result in expulsion from the horse park.

Turn LEFT to take the CA-86S-Expressway S ramp. 0.2 miles, Merge onto CA-86 Spur S. 5.2 miles. Turn RIGHT onto Airport Blvd. 2.2 miles. End at 85-555 Airport Blvd.

PARCEL DELIVERIES: Management will not be responsible for mail or parcel deliveries made to exhibitors, vendors or others. Please make arrangements accordingly.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: Alcoholic Beverages in any form may not be brought onto the show grounds
