## we can't wait to get back to showing at the horse park.

The desert is beautiful, winter is around the corner, the facility is almost ready, we have a great competition planned...it's time to get going.

As you can imagine, there are a few things to cover as we prepare to launch our season. So here it goes.

1. We continue to invest in the horse park and the service we provide. With perhaps less fanfare than last summer, we continue to invest to improve your - and your horses' - experience at the horse park. We are always surprised by which improvements are most heralded, but collectively we think you'll see meaningful improvements everywhere you look.
A. Footing - We are scheduled to replace the footing in Hunter 5, 6 and 7, including its warm-up area, and in Jumper 2 warm-up. With this completed, the footing in all of the rings in the horse park will have been replaced. Needless to say, maintaining 1.6 million square feet of footing to the highest standard is a challenging task, and we continue to expand the resources and tools needed for this task.
B. Wash racks - We have expanded and upgraded the wash racks near Barn 1 and near Barns 15 and 17 . With these completed, all of the wash racks have been upgraded at the horse park.
C. Food offerings - You'll find a host of new food outlets across from Jumper 2. We hope these outlets, which will include salads, a grill, and poke, will provide the right level of hospitality apart from VIP. You'll also see a roving cart offering complimentary refreshments every Friday, Saturday, and Sunday during all major circuits.
D. Parking - We will be offering an expanded shuttle service this season as well as a new reserved parking area behind barn 5. While parking will always be challenging, we hope these additions will continue to improve the options available.
E. Tents/stalls - This year we will complete the transition to clear span tents and $12 \times 12$ stalls. All of the stalls now offered will be $12 x 12$ (except for a few supplemental tents located near barns 14/15 and barn 11 that provide stabling overflow capacity for these barns). We are proud that we offer the highest quality stabling of any facility around.
F. Landscaping - This is one challenge that will never end. But we continue to add trees and plants that increase the beauty of the horse park and to do our part for the environment.
G. Scoreboards - We have added permanent scoreboards/video boards in Hunter 1 and 2, Jumper 1, and on the grass field.
H. Grass, grass, and more grass - You'll find the grass keeps getting better. We are really pleased with the condition of the grass competition field. We also invested to improve the grass underneath the paddocks. And thanks to the generosity of one of our sponsors, we have added three acres of new grass for grazing and walking beyond the paddocks next to the schooling ring.
2. We have a very different schedule. At one level, the changes to our schedule are apparent: we have added a third week to Desert Holiday and a ninth week to Desert Circuit, with two off weeks instead of one. At another level, the more you look into the details of the schedule, the more changes you'll see. The reasons for these changes are complex, driven in large part by the USEF's decision to vacate the calendar and the need to build a competition that positions the horse park at the top of the sport. We encourage you to read the details to understand all of the changes that have been made, and we will be working hard to highlight the changes in our communication over the next several months.
A. More weeks - The redesign of our circuits started with the USEF's decision to vacate the calendar for 2023 and to have significant input into the California show calendar. For example, USEF would not support four weeks in a row of competition. Therefore, by definition, the Desert Circuit schedule had to change. Since we could not offer a competitive winter circuit with only six weeks of competition and because the shows would be too big, after much discussion with USEF, we opted to expand to nine weeks with two off-weeks. Starting earlier with nine weeks offers a number of important advantages. It has more weeks operating during cooler months and allows us to run smaller shows as riders opt to spread out which weeks they compete. We are excited about the shift in Desert Circuit, though are aware it will take a few years for people to sort out their preference for when to attend. The addition of the extra week in December brings back a fan favorite. While small, the passion for the third week of Desert Holiday is huge, and allows us to run a boutique show, with most of the jumper program on the grass field. We think more weeks gives more choice, which is good, and allows people to rest their horses without feeling pressure to "miss out" on a competition.
B. An expanded high performance jumper program - Our high-performance jumper program is critical to us. The West Coast needs a robust program which challenges the very best riders while bringing along horses and riders as they approach the top level. Our program this year will consist of three levels: a greatly expanded FEI tier for those riders aspiring to compete globally, a strong national standard $\$ 50,000$ Grand Prix program with a series championship during Desert Circuit IX, and a new $1.40 \mathrm{~m} \$ 30,000$ program with a series championship during Desert Circuit IX. We are thrilled with how this program has evolved and we believe it gives the best opportunity for riders and horses to develop at the right pace with the right challenge over the entire winter season.
C. A commitment to Premier hunter - On December 1, the USEF/USHJA hunter classifications change to a three-tier system. At the top level is Premier. The number of Premier shows across the country has been reduced dramatically and each Premier show must offer and pay a minimum of $\$ 75,000$ in prize money. You'll find that this shift has created fundamental changes in our competition schedule, most notably on Sundays when the Amateur Owner $3^{\prime} 3^{\prime \prime}$ and $3^{\prime} 6^{\prime \prime}$ Classics rise to $\$ 10,000$ competitions and the addition of an Amateur Owner $3^{\prime} 0^{\prime \prime}$ division with $\$ 5,000$ in prize money. With these, and a host of other changes added to the existing core elements in our Hunter program, such as our expansive USHJA National and International Derby series, we think we now have a hunter program that rivals any in the country. With 12 weeks of Premier Hunter shows, we think we stand alone in our commitment to hunter excellence.
D. More championships - We have expanded the number of formal championship events that occur at the horse park. These events include the Major League Show Jumping events, which now boasts a CSI 5* AA Grand Prix during DH II, the Onondarka Medal Finals during NSS II and the second \$100,000 WCHR West Coast Hunter Spectacular during NSS I (postponed from March). These are in addition to the existing events that we continue to invest in to make more special, including the CPHA Style of Riding Finals, the NCEA Medal Finals - West, our USHJA International Hunter Derby program, and the three weeks of WCHR we host.
E. An elevation of specialty classes - We believe that our specialty class program has been critical to creating a distinctive schedule and adding exciting new challenges for riders. This year we have elevated a number of these classes with the $\$ 25,000$ Pro Eq Challenge, the $\$ 10,000$ Hunter Team Challenge, the new 1.40 m and National Standard Grand Prix series rider bonuses, and the addition of a 4 -year-old young jumper class to add to our already strong young jumper and young hunter program.
3. Yes, we'll have a very different set of biosecurity plans in place. Over the last several months, we have been working closely with USEF, UC Davis, and the CDFA. We, like you, don't want to ever have an outbreak of EHV-1 again. And the odds are we won't. But it is not that simple, and hope is not a strategy. The objectives are clear; we need to prevent sick horses from coming to horse shows, we need to prevent horses from getting sick at a horse show, we need to find horses that do get sick at a horse show, and we need to isolate and treat horses that do get sick. In conjunction with USEF and the other major winter circuits, we will be implementing new biosecurity plans. Collectively, we believe this is the best starting path, though we are all still learning, and we will adapt as we go. These plans include:
> A. New requirements for arrival - In advance of horses arriving at the horse park, owners/trainers will need to submit documentation that includes a health certificate as well as declarations on the health and status of each horse. These will be explained in more detail as we approach the start of the season but will be verified as horses arrive, prior to moving into stalls.
> B. Monitoring procedures for horses on the property - We will be requiring temperature checks for horses on the property and owners/trainers will be required to report febrile horses. These horses will be tested and kept separate until confirmation of test results.
> C. What to do if a horse gets sick - Rapid isolation and aggressive treatment are instrumental to preventing additional exposure and reducing the risk of EHM.

## 4. We will do our part, but need your help. We are a powerful community when we work together.

We operate a small city from November to March. And the safety of our community, both people and horses, depends on each other. We fully accept our responsibility and our role in making the horse park great and safe. But we need everyone to pitch in. Whether it is biosecurity, safe driving, protecting our youth, having our dogs on a leash, or quiet time in the barns at night, we can't - and don't want to - be a police force. We share a passion for our sport and that has to extend to each other. Please help us make the horse park an amazing and safe place to be.

5. Our aspiration is the same. At the outset, when we purchased the horse park, our objective was simple: create a great horse park. We described that there were three components; the physical facility, the hospitality, and the competition. While we will continually improve the physical facility, more of the changes from now on will be incremental. In short, the big stuff has been done. It is a huge task to keep it maintained and fresh, which we will do. And we learn each year the small things that need to be done. But the basics of our physical facility will be the same for the future. Our hospitality, and how our guests feel while here, is an area of focus for us now. It has many elements, from our food offerings to how we handle parking. We have a lot to improve here, and we are focused on it every single day. We certainly appreciate your input. This year, as described above, we are making a significant investment in the competition program. This investment involves
as much money over time as the investment in the physical facility. There are lots of details involved in the three components. But it can be best described this way: we believe the West Coast needs a national/international destination for riders of all levels. We believe that Desert International Horse Park can be that destination that provides people on the West Coast the same opportunity to ride and compete that exists on the East Coast. Over time, we believe people from all over will want to compete here, even if just for a few weeks. There is nothing that makes us prouder than seeing the best riders in the world ride in a CSI5* event here, except perhaps seeing a seven-year-old on his/her pony collecting a first blue ribbon.

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, lícensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and
("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):
A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.
B. ## EQUINE HEALTH AND BIOSECURITY REQUIREMENTS

DIHP will detail new Biosecurity Protocols and Practices by October 1. These new protocols and practices have been developed in consultation with UC Davis, CDFA, Merck Animal Health, and the USEF EHV-1 Committee. The new protocols and practices will require additional documentation regarding the health of horses arriving at the DIHP. These include the following below

## 1) PROOF OF VACCINATION AND COMPLIANCE WITH GR844

Via a signed statement from the attending veterinarian that the horse has been vaccinated against the following:

## Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: Equine Influenza (EIV) <br> Within 6 months ( 180 days) of each show: Rhinopneumonitis (EHV 1 and EHV 4)

If a vaccination will expire during one of the shows, the horse must receive its new vaccination prior to being issued a competition number for that show. Statement of vaccination must be on Official Letterhead and must contain the Show Name of each horse.

If the vaccine has been administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor must provide, upon request, a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; the name, serial number, and expiration date of the vaccine; and the date of the vaccine administration.

## 2) INTERSTATE OR INTRASTATE HEALTH CERTIFICATE (CVI)

Required

These document must be submitted prior to the arrival of the horse to the showgrounds. The CVI must indicate the horse's registered (show) name, and be signed by an accredited USDA veterinarian within 7 days of arrival.

## 3) USEF DECLARATION OF HEALTH

Via a signed statement by owner/trainer for each horse declaring that:
a) Horse has not had a fever above 101.5 or (101.1) if the horse is taking NSAIDs or any other fever suppressing treatment drug during the last 72 hours.
b) Horse has not been exposed to or treated for a fever of unknown origin within the last 28 days
c) Horse has received a negative EHV-1 test within the last 30 days if it had previously tested positive during the past 6 months

Horses/ponies are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of each over fences performance. Horses/ponies may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion.

General: All classes in rated hunter divisions will be judged on performance and soundness and when indicated, conformation, suitability or manners.

Hunter Champion and Reserve: Champion and Reserve to be awarded in accordance with HU150.
Warm-Up: Ticketed warm-ups will be offered Tuesday through Sunday in designated rings. Please wear your back number for ticketed warm-ups. The back number worn will be charged $\$ 30$ per warm-up.

Hunters General: Spreads not to exceed fence height. No jog.

- 2'6" Low Children's and Adult Hunter
- 2'-2'6" Children's Ponv Hunter
C. Hunter Team Challenge riders may not compete in any class 3'6" or higher at the host competition.
II. Participation:
A. Riders do not have to apply. Riders must pre-enter the USHJA Hunter Team Challenge a minimum of one hour prior to the start of the Team Challenge Rider Meeting.

1. USHJA Hunter Team Challenge: $\$ 75$ entry fee per/rider to USHJA. Host competition will collect USHJA fee and submit to USHJA.
B. There will be three sections of the Team Challenge
2. 3' Children's and Adult Amateur Hunters
3. $2^{\prime} 6$ '" Low Children's and Adult Hunters

C. 16 riders per section will be accepted based on a first come, first served basis.
D. A grand total of 48 riders can participate in the Team Challenge.

The Rider Meeting must be held the day before the start of the Team Challenge. The meeting will include an overview of the rules, scoring, and draw of teams. At the discretion of the host, there may be additional activities such as a dinner or snacks and drinks.

VIII. Team Challenge Format
A. General

1. Scores will be tracked after each class is complete and be displayed throughout the day.
2. Awards presentation will immediately follow the conclusion of the Final Round.
3. Riders can complete their regular division classes as scheduled at the conclusion of the awards presentation.
B. Day One
4. Team Challenge classes will run concurrently with the horse show's regular division classes on the first day.
5. The 3' Children's and Adult Amateur Hunter, $2^{\prime} 6^{\prime \prime}$ Low Children's and Adult, and the Children's Pony Hunter will run as an overlay with the regular division.
C. Day Two
6. Under Saddle
a. Each height section will have their own under saddle class: 3' Children's and Adult Amateur, 2'6" Low Child and Adult, and Children's Ponv.
b. All under saddle classes must be held at the beginning of Day Two prior to the Final Round.
c. Each entry will be scored under an open numeric system 0-100.
7. Final Round Each entry will be scored under an open numeric system 0-100.
a. Must be held immediately following the designated Hunter Team Challenge under saddle classes on Day Two.
b. All teams are invited to compete in the Final Round.
c. Each rider will compete over one Classic style round at their respective height.
d. The Final Round will be placed as one section from $1^{\text {st }}-8^{\text {th }}$
e. Each team's highest score from the Final Round will be doubled and added to their overall Team Scores. If a horse/rider combination from one of the top six teams is unable to compete in the Final Round for any reason, there will be no substitutions and the team will compete in the Final Round with only their available team members who competed on Day One.

## D. Overall Team Champion

1. The Team Champion is the one with the highest Team Score after the Final Round.
2. If there is a tie for any top six overall team placing, the team with the highest combined score from the second over fences on Day One will break the tie. If the teams have the same combined score in the second over fences, then the highest pointed rider from each team will answer a tie-breaking question pulled from the USHJA Horsemanship Quiz Challenge Study Guide. Questions will be given by a horse show official and will be tailored to the level of each height section. If there are multiple riders with the same score on one team, then the Hunter Team Challenge Liaison will select the designated rider chosen to answer the question.
IX. The following Zone HOTY points will be awarded to each team member of the top 8 teams overall. Points to be awarded to each horse and rider combination's applicable section for the current competition year.

X. Awards

Team Overall, Champion through $6^{\text {th }}$ place ribbons will be awarded. The Champion team will receive coolers, and medals awarded to the Gold, Silver, and Bronze medal teams. Victory gallop of the Champion team is optional. The Final Round will receive Ribbons $1^{\text {st }}-8^{\text {th }}$, and the highest scoring rider from the Final Round will receive a trophy.

## V. Hunter Team Challenge Liaison

The USHJA Hunter Team Challenge Liaison is not the coach or trainer of the teams. The Liaison is responsible to be the main point of contact, understand the Team Challenge rules and specifications, and provide communication between participants, trainers, horse show staff, and USHJA. The Liaison will be determined prior to the beginning of the Team Challenge and must meet the following criteria:
A. Current member in a good standings with USHJA and USEF
B. Be declared a professional
C. Current Safe Sport Certified
D. Attend Rider meeting at Event
VI. Team Composition
A. Teams are made up of a maximum of four (4) and minimum of three (3) horse-and-rider combinations. Teams are determined by random draw.
B. Teams comprised of one rider from each height section; one 3' (Child or Adult) rider, one 2'6" (Child or Adult) rider, and one Children's Pony (Small/Medium or Large) rider, until all teams possible have one rider from each section. The remaining riders will have their teams randomly drawn. USHJA has the final decision on the composition and combination of the teams.
C. Teams will have designated colored arm bands, and the option to braid in colored yarn or other team spirit is encouraged and will not be penalized in the rider's regular division.
D. A maximum of 16 riders per section to create a maximum of 12 total teams.
E. If a rider scratches after the team draw a four (4) rider team will become a three (3) rider team system, a three (3) team rider scratched spot will automatically receive zero points and be the drop off score.
VII. Scoring
A. A rider's Overall Score will be determined by adding together their numerical score received for their two over fences classes from their designated division on Day One and their score from the Team Challenge under saddle class on Dav Two. Overall Scores will count toward their Team's score.
B. Team Scores will be determined by adding each team member's Overall Score. Four-member teams will drop their lowest score. Three-member teams will drop the lowest score and double the second lowest score. This will ensure that all teams have the benefit of a dropped score.
C. Final Team Scores for awards are determined by adding the Team Scores and the score from the team's highest rider from the Final Round.
D. Judges will be required to score all riders in an open numerical scoring system in each overlay class and the designated Hunter Team Challenge under saddle on Day Two.

ELIGIBILITY - Class 703 is open to all and Class 707 is restricted to Juniors/Amateurs. Riders are limited to four (4) horses in this class. CONDITIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS - Fences 3'0", with at least four (4) option fences 3'5" per round. To be judged under the Open Numerical scoring system by two panels of two judges each. One Panel will be designated the tiebreaking panel for Round 1; this panel will also be the tiebreaking panel for the jump-off, if any. The other Panel will be the tie-breaking panel for Round 2. To be scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is not permissible in any round.

ROUND 1: To be shown over a Hunter Classic course of at least 10 fences. In addition to the base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped. Scores will be added to determine the total score for the round. The top 12 will return in reverse of scores for the Second Round. In the case of ties, the Base score of the tie-breaking panel will be used to break the tie.

ROUND 2: To be shown over a Handy Hunter course of at least 8 fences. In addition to the base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped. Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. Scores will be added to determine the total score for the round. In the case of ties, the Base score of the tie-breaking panel will be used to break the tie.

Scores from Round 1 and Round 2 will be added to determine the overall winners. In the case of a tie for First Place, a jump-off will be held. In the case of ties for all other places, the Base score of the Round 2 tie-breaking panel will be used to break the tie.

POINTS AND AWARDS - In order to earn USEF Horse of the Year points, exhibitors must declare in which section points are to count by submitting a completed USHJA Declaration

Form to the Show Office by the end of the competition. Points accrued by horses shown by Professionals may be awarded to the declared Green Hunter 3'0", Green Hunter 3'3' Performance Hunter 3'3" or Small Hunter. Points accrued by horses shown by Juniors or Amateurs may be awarded to the declared Green Hunter 3'0", Green Hunter 3'3" Performance Hunter 3'3", or the applicable Children's, Pony, Adult Amateur, Amateur Owner 3'3", Small Hunter or Junior Hunter 3'3. The money won and points won in the USHJA National Hunter Derby will only be awarded towards a declared Hunter section for HOTY points if a horse competes in the declared section a minimum of 1 time during the competition year. National HOTY championship points will not be awarded. (see HU192.9b)

SECURE STABLING - Horses must purchase a stall and be stabled on the grounds 24 hours prior to the start of the class. Horses must remain on the competition grounds until finished competing in the Derby. Any horse in violation of this requirement will be disqualified.

HORSE INSPECTION - Horses entered in this class will NOT be required to jog for soundness. Any unsoundness during the competition will be reflected in the scores from the judges (GR 1033.6).

SCHOOLING REQUIREMENTS - During the 24 hour period prior to the class, horses must be ridden in official horse show schooling areas only unless Management designates a specific schooling area for National Hunter Derby horses. Competition number must be worn at all times while mounted.

ORDER OF GO - The Order of Go for the First Round will be drawn. The Order for the Second Round will be reverse order of scores from Round 1. Should a jump-off occur, horses will return in the same order in which they competed in the second round.

ATTIRE - Refer to HU128 in the USEF Rule Book for current specifications.

RIBBONS AND AWARDS - Ribbons 1-12 for Overall.

ELIGIBILITY - Open to all. Riders are limited to four (4) horses in this class. Horses are not required to show in any other class at the competition, but may compete in any class for which they are otherwise eligible. Owners, Riders and Trainers must be current Active Competing Members of USEF and USHJA. Horses must have USEF Recording and USHJA Registration. Change of rider after the First Round is not permissible.

CONDITIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS - Fences 3'6"-4', with at least four (4) option fences 4'3' or higher per round. To be judged under the Open Numerical scoring system by two panels of two judges each. One Panel will be designated the tie-breaking panel for Round 1; this panel will also be the tie-breaking panel for the jump-off, if any. The other Panel will be the tie-breaking panel for Round 2. To be scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is not permissible in any round.

ROUND 1: To be shown over a Hunter Classic course of at least 10 fences. In addition to the base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped. Scores will be added to determine the total score for the round. The top 12 will return in reverse of scores for the Second Round. In the case of ties, the Base score of the tiebreaking panel will be used to break the tie.

ROUND 2: To be shown over a Handy Hunter course of at least 8 fences. In addition to the base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped and a Handy Bonus Score between zero and 10 bonus points. Scores will be added to determine the total score for the round. In the case of ties, the Base score of the tie-breaking panel will be used to break the tie.

Scores from Round 1 and Round 2 will be added to determine the overall winners. In the case of a tie for First Place, a Jumpoff will be held. In the case of ties for all other places, the Base score of the Round 2 tie-breaking panel will be used to break the tie.

ROUND 3: In the case of an overall tie for First Place, a Jump-off will be held. To be shown over a course of at least 8 fences. Scoring to be the same as for the Handy Hunter Round. Jump-off score to be added to the total score from Round 1 and Round 2 to determine the winners.

POINTS AND AWARDS - In order to earn USEF Horse of the Year points, exhibitors must declare in which section points are to count by submitting a completed USHJA Declaration Form to the Show Office by the end of the competition. Only Juniors and Amateurs may declare for the applicable Junior or Amateur-Owner section. In order to earn points toward IHD Awards and Finals, Horses must
be enrolled in the International Hunter Derby program. Enrollment is not required to compete in the class.

SECURE STABLING - Horses must purchase a stall and be stabled on the grounds 24 hours prior to the start of the class. Horses must remain on the competition grounds until finished competing in the Derby. Any horse in violation of this requirement will be disqualified.

HORSE INSPECTION - Horses must jog for soundness during the Official Jog the morning of the class. Time and location to be announced. Horses must be officially entered in the Derby prior to the jog. If a horse does not pass the jog, there will be one opportunity for the horse to be re-presented at a time to be determined, up to one hour prior to the start of the class.

SCHOOLING REQUIREMENTS - During the 24 hour period prior to the class, horses must be ridden in official horse show schooling areas only. Competition number must be worn at all times while mounted.

ORDER OF GO - The Order of Go for the First Round will be drawn. The Order for the Second Round will be reverse order of scores from Round 1. The Order for the Jump-off, if any, will be the same as that for Round 2.

High Score Awards: A jacket will be awarded to the riders who achieve the single highest numerical score in any one class, within their respective hunter section, in each of the nine WCHR categories: Professional, Developing Professional, Amateur Owner 3'6", Amateur Owner 3'3', Adult Amateur, Junior 3'6", Junior 3'3", Children's and Pony. * * Should a tie occur between two (2) or more riders for high score within a category or for the Leading Hunter Rider, the rider with the highest cumulative over fences in that category will be awarded the WCHR high score award and WCHR Leading Hunter Rider award. Riders must be enrolled in the 2022 WCHR program to be eligible for a high score award and are only eligible for an award in their declared category.

WCHR Hunter Spectacular

## I. ENTRY FORMAT OPTIONS

a. Open Entry Format:
i. Entries for the Spectacular class will be open to ALL enrolled WCHR riders competing at 3 '6" or above. (Professionals, Amateurs and Juniors).
ii. Riders may ride no more than three (3) horses in the class.
iii. Horses are not required to have shown in any other class at the WCHR event to be eligible.
iv. In the event the Spectacular receives fifty (50) or more entries, management may choose to bring back more than the top twelve (12) for the second round. Up to $30 \%$ of the total entries (Maximum of 25 horses).

1. If show management wishes to have the option to bring back more than the top twelve (12) for the second round, they must specify this in their prize list.
b. Qualifying Entry Format:
i. The Champion and Reserve Champion horse-and-rider combinations of the WCHR hunter sections 3 ' 6 " or higher during the WCHR Spectacular week will be invited to compete in the class. If the Champion or Reserve Champion horse-and-rider combination from any section declines to participate then Management may choose to invite the 3rd and 4th place horse-andrider combinations of that same section to compete.
ii. Horse-and-rider combinations will compete at the respective height of the section from which they qualified.
iii. Riders must be enrolled in the WCHR program to be eligible for the class.
iv. A horse must be ridden by the same rider throughout the entire hunter section (exception: under saddle classes) to be eligible to compete in the WCHR Hunter Spectacular. Qualifying to compete in the WCHR Hunter Spectacular is based on the horse-and-rider combination; no horse or rider substitutions allowed.
v. Riders may qualify no more than two (2) horses for the class.
vi. When qualifying from more than one section, the qualifying horse-and-rider combination will compete in the Spectacular from the section from which they have the highest number of points on the championship chart. In the case of an equal amount of points in more than one (1) section, the horse and-rider combination will compete in the Spectacular from the section from which they first qualified.
c. The entry format chosen by management MUST be specified in the prize list and on the host application form.
d. When utilizing the qualifying entry format, show management is solely responsible for tracking and inviting eligible riders.
e. Show management is responsible for procuring all rider declarations prior to the start of the class regardless of the entry format used.

## II. ENROLLMENT AND PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

a. Riders, owners, and trainers must be current Active members of USEF and USHJA to participate in this class. (see GR202).
b. Riders and Trainers must have a current WCHR enrollment to participate in this class.
c. Horses must be registered with USHJA to participate in this class.
d. When utilizing an open format, the spectacular is open to Professionals, Amateurs and Juniors. Riders may ride a maximum of three (3) horses for this class.
e. A horse is not required to have shown in any other class at the WCHR Event to be eligible to compete.* f. *When utilizing qualifying for the Spectacular, riders must be Champion or Reserve in any 3'6" or higher sections during the week to receive an invite to the class. Riders may ride a maximum of two (2) horses. g. The Spectacular will count for HOTY points and money won (where applicable) in the section declared at the time of entry, for which the horse must be eligible and that corresponds to the height jumped in the Spectacular. The two-round stand- alone Hunter Classic point scale will be utilized when awarding National HOTY bonus points. See HU173.9(b).
h. HOTY points and money won will only be awarded towards a declared Hunter section for HOTY points if the horse competes in the declared section a minimum of five (5) times during the competition year.
i. Each horse-and-rider combination must declare the height at which they will show when they enter the class. j. This class will be conducted under USEF General Rules and drug testing procedures.
k. All horses entered in the class must jog for soundness before the start of the class to be eligible to compete. i. Formal attire is requested.

## III. HOTY POINTS/ MONEY WON

a. In order for HOTY points to be awarded, riders must

complete a USHJAWWCHR Declaration Form prior to the class.
b. Points accrued by horses shown by Professionals may be awarded to: Green 3'6", Performance 3'6", Green Conformation 3'6", Green 3'9', High Performance Conformation, High Performance Hunter.
c. Points accrued by horses shown by Juniors or Amateurs may be awarded to: Amateur Owner 3'6" 18-35, 36 and Over, Junior 3'6" Large Younger, Large Older, Small Younger, Small Older.
d. The Spectacular will count for HOTY points and money won (where applicable) in the section declared at the time of entry, for which the horse must be eligible and that corresponds to the height jumped in the Spectacular. The two-round stand- alone Hunter Classic point scale will be utilized when awarding National HOTY bonus points. See HU173.9(b).
e. HOTY points and money won will only be awarded towards a declared Hunter section for HOTY points if the horse competes in the declared section a minimum of five (5) times during the competition year.
f. The Spectacular class does not count towards WCHR Points.

## IV. JUDGING SYSTEM

a. This is a two (2) round class.
b. Both rounds are to be judged by a minimum of two (2) judging panels consisting of two (2) judges each. Each panel will provide one (1) score for each round, which will be averaged.
c. In case of a tie in either the first or second round: Panel One's score is the tie-breaker.
d. The first round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality, substance, and movement.
e. The second round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality, substance, movement, handiness, and brilliance of pace. Handiness is defined as ground saving movement without adversely affecting performance or style. Brilliance of pace is defined as a faster pace than ordinary, without sacrificing performance or style. No trot fences will be permitted.
f. Overall Score - The average score from each round will be added to obtain the overall total for each horse.

## V. JUDGING REQUIREMENTS

a. Both rounds are to be judged by a minimum of two (2) judging panels consisting of two (2) judges each. A minimum of one $R$ rated judge is required per panel.
b. Open numerical scoring system will be utilized with each panels' score announced and then averaged for to determine a final average numerical score for each horse.
c. All judges must be Federation licensed and in good standing
with the Federation and USHJA.
d. A judging assistant must be present during all phases of the competition. The duties of the judging assistant include notifying the Judges if a rail comes down. The judging assistant is not required to be a licensed official and is not responsible for the scoring of the judging panels. A competition staff member may fill this role.

## VI. COURSE REQUIREMENTS

a. The course will consist of a minimum of ten (10) obstacles of at least six (6) different types. Fence heights of $3^{\prime} 6$ ", 3 '9" or 4'0".
b. The course diagrams for each round must be posted a minimum of one hour before the start of the first round. Copies of the course(s) must also be available for distribution at the Riders Meeting.
c. Jumps in all Rounds:
i. Obstacles must simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field and the course must offer a variety of jumps with different appearances such as: natural post and rail, split rail, stone wall, white board fence, riviera gate, coop, aiken, hedge, oxer, brush, logs, natural foliage, a jump with no standards. ii. Natural obstacles such as banks are permitted.
iii. A minimum 2" difference is required for the back element of an obstacle.
iv. For appropriate jumps, no ground line is necessary.
v. The jumpable portion of any obstacle must be a minimum of eight feet on its front face.
vi. Flat cups may only be used for obstacles involving logs and/or in accordance with Federation rules. d. Classic Hunter Style Round (First Round)
i. A minimum of 10 obstacles must be offered in the Classic Hunter Style Round.
ii. At least one in and out.
iii. At least one bending line. Approaches to jumps and/or bending lines off both leads.
iv. At least one line with an unrelated distance.
v. At least one fence with a long approach.
e. Playoff Handy Round (Second Round)
i. A minimum of 10 obstacles must be offered in the Second/ Spectacular Round.
ii. The course should simulate riding over hunt country. Gimmicky options are not appropriate. iii. At least one in and out.
iv. At least one bending line. Approaches to jumps and/or bending lines off both leads.
v. At least one line with an unrelated distance.
vi. At least one fence with a long approach.

vii. Management may also include: hand gallop between markers, halt, pen/circle of jumps, snake jump or a $\vee$ jump that can be jumped as a bounce, one stride or two stride. The course designer may offer a designated optional track, riders that attempt this track will accumulate 5 bonus points.
viii. The top twelve (12) horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.
ix. In the event management runs the class with open entries, and receives fifty (50) or more entries, they may choose to bring back more than the top twelve (12) for the second round. Up to $30 \%$ of the total entries (Maximum of 25 horses).

1. If show management wishes to have the option to bring back more than the top twelve (12) for the second round, they must specify as such in their prize list.

## VII. COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS

a. An Officials Meeting will be held prior to the Riders Meeting. Judges, Course Designer, Steward, and Competition Manager are required to meet prior to the start of the class to review the specifications and judging system.
b. A Riders Meeting will be held prior to the start of the class to answer any questions regarding the course and class specifications. The meeting will be conducted by a USHJA/ WCHR Representative assisted by management, a large $R$ licensed Steward, one officiating Judge and the Course Designer.
c. All horses entered in the class must jog for soundness before the start of the class to be eligible to compete. The designated jog area, time and order will be determined by management and conducted prior to the course walk. Once the Jog order is posted, no further substitutions may made. All horses must be presented at the Official Jog with their actual competition number and wearing a conventional hunter bridle and noseband. Proper attire is required (riding clothes or proper attire that an exhibitor would wear to compete in a model class.) The jog will be officiated by a minimum of one (1) large $R$ licensed judge, one (1) large $R$ licensed steward and the official veterinarian.
d. Once the jog has commenced, horses may only be ridden in designated schooling areas. Horses must be accompanied
by their competition number for the duration of the competition day after they have been presented for the jog.
e. There will be one (1) course walk, for both rounds, before the start of the first round.

## VIII. AWARDS AND PRIZE MONEY

a. All riders in the top 12 overall (or their designated representative if they are not available) must ride for ribbons in order to receive prize money.
b. Winner receives: Cooler, Keeper Frame, Jacket Certificate.
c. Bridle ribbons and Neck Sashes: 1st-12th.
d. With prior permission from USHJA competition management may offer additional awards (e.g., highest placing junior owner, highest placing amateur, highest placing thoroughbred, highest placing rider competing on only one entry in the class).
e. Prize Money Break down:

saving pace and track. The judge's jump off score of the rider is added to their first round score and the rider with the highest cumulative score and the least faults is the winner. Time allowed will be based on a speed of $375 \mathrm{~m} / \mathrm{m}$, in the Jump off round.

The judges are asked to walk the course when possible and where there are striding options, the judges are asked not to penalize any option that might be used to achieve the best result appropriate to the track taken and the individual horse/ rider combination. The judges will eavaluate the rider's ability as a show jumping rider, and the manner in which the course was ridden regarding technical merit, judgment, and the execution of an efficient, time saving pace and track in meeting the specific challenges incorporated into the course by the course designer.

The open numerical scoring system will be used, and the judge's score will be announced after each round. The remaining placings for the class (competitors not participating in the jump off), will be determined by the rider with the least number of faults and the highest judge's score.(Basically scored as a jumper class, but the judge's score instead of the time breaks the tie when there is an equality of faults.

START ORDER - Round 1 will be computer drawn, round 2 (The jump off round for clean rounds) will be from low to high from the Judge's score from the first round. Follow USEF Jumper Schooling Rules.

TACK \& EQUIPMENT - A Jumper Type horse and conventional Jumper Equipment will not be penalized. A Standing or Running Martingale is permitted. Draw Reins, German Martingales or other non-conventional tack is NOT permitted.

RESTRICTIONS - USEF Jumper Schooling Rules will be in effect. There is to be no contact between the exhibitor and trainer with either the judges or the course designer prior to or at the conclusion of any round without a specified Technical Delegate or Show Steward present.

AWARDS - Trophy and Cooler to the winner, and Ribbons and Prizes 1-8.

The jump off/work off will be scored in the same manner as the first round, with an emphasis placed on an efficient time

ELIGIBILITY - The top 50 riders from the West Coast ranking list will be invited to compete in the Finals.

QUALIFYING PERIOD - All classes held at shows starting on or after August 21st of the previous year, through shows starting on or before August 20th of the current year will be counted toward this year's finals. Winners of the Finals are no longer eligible to compete in qualifying classes or the Final again. Any rider who will not be eligible to compete in the next year as a junior may not compete in qualifying classes after August 20th.

CONDITIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS - To consist of Three Phases with fences at 3'3". To be judged under the Open Numerical Scoring system. Competitors must ride the same horse in Phases 1 and 2.

PHASE 1 - Over Fences - The Over Fences portion will be conducted over a course of at least 10 fences at 3'3" including a double and a triple combination. The course must include at least two changes of direction. Hunter style fences and jumper style fences are allowed, or a combination of the two. Water obstacles and liverpools are not permitted. An open numerical system of scoring must be used for the fences phase.

PHASE 2 - Flat - The top 20\% or top ten scoring riders, whichever is greater, will return for the flat phase. An open numerical system of scoring must be used for the flat phase. The riders will be asked to perform any of USEF Tests 1-19 as well as 2 out of 3 movements of shoulder in, haunches in, or leg yield both directions of the ring.

PHASE 3 - Bracket Style - The top four riders, as determined by the combination of the fences and flat phase (each counting equally), will return for the bracket phase. The fourth and first place rider will compete over a course of at least 8 fences on the same horse. The second and third place rider will compete over a course of at least 8 fences on the same horse. The winners of each head to head will compete for the championship and reserve and the other two riders will compete head to head for third and fourth place. Fifth through tenth place will be awarded based on scores from the fences and flat phases.

SCORING - Scores from Phase 1 and 2 will be added to determine the top 4 to compete in Bracket Phase, and to determine placings fifth through tenth. Champion and Reserve will be determined by the final Bracket ride-off. Third and Fourth place will be determined by adding each rider's scores from Phase 1 and 2 and their bracket semifinal score. In the event of a tie for any place, the score from Phase 1 will be used to break the tie.

TACK \& EQUIPMENT - Conventional tack per USEF EQ105.5.

ORDER OF GO - Order of go for each phase will be drawn the day before the competition.

AWARDS - Trophy and Cooler for Overall Champion, Prizes and Ribbons 1-10 for Overall.

## MEDAL FINALS

Challenge Medal has two rounds over fences. All will have mandatory work-offs. No apprentice or learner judges may sit with or participate during SCHSA Medal Finals Classes. The same horse must be used for all phases of a Final including, but not limited to: Flat phase; Rounds One and/or Two; Work-off; and Warm-up. (Warm-up rounds are not required, but when ridden are considered the first phase.) Exceptions may be approved by the Executive board and/or the Finals Technical Delegate in the event of schedule changes to due acts of God, i.e. rain, wind, fire. c. Except for riders qualifying for a Medal Finals by competing in the qualifier at a Finals Event, eligibility protests must be filed in writing to the SCHSA seven (7) days before a Medal Finals. In extreme circumstances, when ineligibility information is only made available at the Finals show, a protest must be filed with the SCHSA office, official representative or Technical Delegate the day prior to the start of that Finals or at least 12 hours prior to the start of the competition during normal competition hours. d. To be eligible to compete in the final Medal qualifier at a Finals event, rider and trainer must be members at least 24 hours prior to the start of the competition. 12e. MEDAL FINALS DRAWS: It is the responsibility of the exhibitors and/or their trainers to enter Medal Final's classes with the show office the day before the draw, so verification of eligibility can be confirmed. Riders not entered in a timely manner will not be included in the draw and once eligibility is confirmed, will be placed at the beginning of the class.

## CHALLENGE MEDAL FINALS

The SCHSA Challenge Medal Finals will consist of two rounds over a three-foot-three-inch (3'3') course of fences. The first-round order will be drawn; the second round will be determined by rider score, low score to high. All riders will show in both rounds. The judges will sit separately during the first two rounds. Each round will count fifty percent (50\%). Judges' scores from each round will be averaged then averages will be added. A minimum of four riders plus any rider within three points of the leader will return to work off. The judges will sit together during the work off. The work-off scores will not be announced. The final placings will be at the sole discretion of the Judges.

## TECHNICAL DELIGATE/JUDGES

There must be a Technical Delegate (TD) for all SCHSA Medal Finals. The TD will be appointed by the Board and will be responsible for meeting with the officials, management, and exhibitors. The TD will meet with the judges before the event to make sure they understand the format and scoring of the class. The TD will be present at the drawing of the order of go. The TD will be present during all aspects of the class to answer any questions that arise. The TD is responsible for insuring the technical requirements of the class are met. In case of a dispute the TD's decision is final. Management will be responsible for the fee of $\$ 50.00$ per medal final or $\$ 150$ per day whichever is greater, as well as lodging and transportation if necessary. SCHSA Board or Technical Delegate must approve the judges used in the finals from those hired by the show. At least one must be from out of the area. Additionally, SCHSA may pay for the second judge, if requested by show management and determined by SCHSA to be not of great use to the show in another capacity. Payment would include fee and travel, and lodging if negotiated. Agreement will be an addendum to the contract, year-to-year, and must be in writing.

MEDAL FINALS POINT CALCULATIONS The Board will appoint a person to calculate the scores for the all Medal Finals. That person will be responsible for doing the calculation of percentage scores for the Medal Finals. Horse show management will be responsible for the fee of $\$ 50.00$ per medal final or $\$ 150$ per day whichever is greater

Martingales: 1.30m or below: No martingale restrictions when used in a conventional manner. Draw Reins permitted in classes below 1.20m or below that do not offer prize money. Above 1.30 m (and all classes restricted to young horses): Only running martingales used in the conventional manner. Note: Ponies may not be ridden by a Junior in draw reins or German martingales at any time.

Ties: Ties involving first place will be jumped off. Ties not involving first place will be decided upon time unless otherwise stated.

24 Hour Rule: Horses must be stabled on the grounds 24 hours prior to any class with prize money of $\$ 25,000$ or more.

Children's and Adult Jumpers: Horses or riders may not cross enter into any Junior or Amateur-Owner Jumper class at the same show. Exception: where fence height is 3 '11". Riders may not cross enter into any Jumper class at the same show with fences exceeding 1.20 m ( $3^{\prime} 11^{\prime \prime}$ ). Fences 1.0m-1.05m (3'3"-3'5") for Low. ## GOVERNING RULES:

USEF: This competition is governed and approved by the United States Equestrian Federation. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. To the extent there is a conflict between the prize list and the USEF rules, USEF rules will prevail.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a $\$ 45$ Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR218) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

REMINDER: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

## COMPETITION AND STALL/ ENTRY DATES:

Stall reservations and entries MUST now be made separately. Stall reservations, entries, and document signatures are required to be submitted by the following dates for the respective competitions. Reservations and entries not received by these dates will still be allowed, subject to availability, but may be subject to a late fee. Exhibitors and trainers are advised that individual show weeks may sell out, even prior to the deadline date below:

These classes, and any fees collected by DIHP on behalf of the affiliate organizations, if any, have received the appropriate approval and documentation by the USEF. At the present time, these affiliate organizations may include California Professional Horseman Association (CPHA), Pacific Coast Horseshow Association (PCHA), SCHSA.

Exhibitors are responsible for knowledge of the Rules and Regulations governing the horse show and for their own errors and omissions. In the case of a violation of a cross entry restriction, the exhibitor will forfeit the entry fee, class placing and prize money award.

## COVID - 19

DIHP will adhere to any and all COVID protocols as required by USEF, FEI, State of California and Riverside County in place at the time of the show. All individuals entering the horse park must abide by these requirements.

## AGREEMENTS AND DOCUMENTS:

USEF ENTRY AGREEMENT By entering a Federationlicensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the Desert Circuit competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR 908.4. The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to
be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges; to change specifications in Jumper classes as competition warrants. Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Show Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s), or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

In the event of a cancellation due to severe weather or other emergency, refunds of entry fees must be made upon request by the exhibitor within 30 days of the cancellation.

## USEF WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND IDEMNITY AGREEMENT:

Effective immediately, all individuals on the property will be required to sign the USEF Waiver and Release of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Idemnity Agreement. The Agreement will be available on our website (www.deserthorsepark.com) and can be executed and signed electronically.

DIHP GENERAL LIABILITY AGREEMENT: All individuals on the property, whether or not they are competing, will be required to sign a general liability agreement. The agreement will be available on the DIHP website and can be executed electronically.

## CONTACT AND EMERGENCY HEALTH INFORMATION:

All individuals on the property are required to provide contact information for themselves and their emergency contact. This information will be used, as needed, to support the County of Riverside Environmental Health contact tracing program. The required information is available on the DIHP website.

SPECTATORS: Spectators will be allowed at the Desert International Horse Park this season, unless a change in rules by FEI, USEF, the State of California, and/or the County of Riverside. Please check our website to the latest update on rules.

SIGNATURES ON DOCUMENTS: Signatures on documents are required to be made by the actual individual. Signatures by others will not be accepted. Electronic

signatures will be allowed.

ENTRIES, FEES, AND PAYMENT:

ENTRIES: Entries will only be accepted on line on the DIHP website through the showgroundslive show management system. There will be a $\$ 350$ non refundable deposit per horse per week. Entries must be received by the deadline posted above. Entries received after the posted deadline will be late and will be charged a late entry fee. Online entry forms must be completed in their entirety. Incomplete forms will not be accepted and will be considered a late entry, subject to a late entry fee. Classes may only be entered or declared by using a Class Number.

PAYMENTS: Fees must be paid in U.S. funds. Checks drawn on Canadian banks must be pre printed by a financial institution with the legend "U.S. Funds" and drawn on a U.S. bank. Visa, Master Card, \& American Express are accepted. Customers paying by credit card will have an additional $3 \%$ processing fee. Payment information must be provided at time of entry. Full payment is required at the end of each week of competition. No balances may be rolled forward to the following week. Exhibitors and trainers who have not settled accounts prior to the beginning of the next week of competition will not be allowed to compete. Exhibitors and trainers may close out and make payment on-line. Management has permission to close out any outstanding balances with payment information provided. Stabling, nominating, and administration fees will not be refunded under any circumstances. Trainers will be held financially responsible for any clients who do not submit viable payment in a timely manner, including late fees. Accounts with returned checks/declined credit cards/ disputed charges will be assessed a penalty of the greater of $\$ 50$ or 10 percent of the face value of the declined amount.

COMPETITION FEES: Each horse will be charged a USEF fee of \$23 per competition (\$15 Drugs and Medication, \$8 USEF), a $\$ 14$ fee to CDFA for Drug Screening, and a non refundable \$7 fee for USHJA. Anyone who is not a member of USEF and/or USHJA will be charged a $\$ 45$ show pass fee by USEF and a $\$ 30$ show pass fee by USHJA. All horses competing in any USEF Computer Ranked Grand Prix at DIHP are subject to USEF International High-Performance fee in accordance with GR207. DIHP assess a fee of $\$ 35$ per horse for participation. FEl horses will pay the $\$ 33$ FEI Horse Fee.

OFFICE FEES: A fee of $\$ 135$ will be charged to each horse for each week of competition. This is the only per horse fee charged by DIHP. This fee includes medical personnel and emergency response, Showgroundslive, security, and office support. It also includes video streaming.

OTHER FEES: An additional fee of $\$ 100$ will be charged for entries received after the closing date, show scratch, nonshowing, failure to close out an account within 24 hours of the competition ending, and missing information on an entry. Horses stabling in season stalls will not be charged weekly
late entry or weekly scratch fees for changing the weeks the horse is showing. A $\$ 50$ per week fee will be added to any horse not purchasing shavings from DIHP for manure management, removal, and disposal. A \$50 fee per class will be added for a rider who competes in a class but failed to enter correctly.

BACK NUMBERS: One back number per horse will be assigned at each DIHP circuit. As per GR908.2, a signature is required on each entry blank for each rider that rides that horse. This signature is the sole responsibility of the rider. Those found riding an entry while displaying a back number assigned to others from DIHP, without having the new rider's signature attached to that entry, assuring the owner's consent to rider, as well as agreeing to all of the rules of the competition and the Federation, will be considered in noncompliance as described in GR908.3 and will be disqualified from the class and competition until a proper entry blank is signed. Back numbers must be worn by the horse with the corresponding microchip number. All horses on the property will be required to have a back number and be registered at the office as a showing horse.

## FOREIGN EXHIBITOR ASSOCIATION REQUIREMENTS:

Owners, riders, and trainers, must provide an electronic copy (English) that they are a member in good standing of their national federation. Riders showing in classes restricted to Junior, Amateur, or Adults must present their membership card or other documentation indicating their Junior or Amateur status. Amateurs must provide or sign for USEF Amateur Status. Foreign Amateur riders must join USEF and sign for Amateur Status. Members of EC must sign for Amateur Status but are not required to join USEF.

HORSE/PONY MEASUREMENT CARD: Horse/ponies showing in Junior Hunter, Pony Hunter, Children's Pony Hunter or Pony Jumper are required to have a USEF Measurement card or arrange to be measured at the show. Foreign measurement cards are not acceptable as proof of measurement.

USEF HORSE RECORDING: Horse must be recorded with USEF annually or for Life in order to be eligible for HOTY Awards and/or Zone Awards.

USHJA HORSE REGISTRATION: All horses competing in USEF licensed Hunter/Jumper/Eq competitions must have or obtain a Registration Number from UHSJA.

MICROCHIPS: All horses/ponies required to have a USHJA number must have a microchip. This number must be recorded with USHJA.

OPPORTUNITY CLASSES: All opportunity classes will be held in accordance with GR821. Riders entered only in these classes are exempt from the Federation membership requirements and are not required to pay a nonmember fee

but are required to list the Federation membership number if the participant is a member.

ADD/SCRATCH/CHANGE: Any class add/scratch/change must be made on ShowGroundslive through the DIHP website by 4 pm on the day before the class is scheduled to run. Class fees will be charged to horses entered at 4PM.

NO DAY OF ADDS: Any exhibitor who does not compete in a class in which he/she is officially entered, and does not scratch according to the Scratch Procedures, will be billed for the class. The horse show policies herein stated regarding scratches and refunds will be followed regardless of weather and in place of GR 912. Once a class or division begins, it may not be scratched, except for a Vet Scratch. If a Vet Scratch, the horse must be scratched electronically through showgroundslive on the DIHP website. The Official Show Vet's Certificate in the Show Office on the day of the class and the Official Show Vet's Certificate must be received electronically by the end of the competition day and a scratch fee will still apply. A class that has been closed may not be scratched.

STALLS: The following rules will be in place for stalls. Failure to comply with stall rules will result in loss of stall usage with no refund.

1) Stalls are not transferable and use is limited to horses entered under the trainer's name who rented the stall
2) Access to a barn/ tent is limited to trainers/ owners/ employees of stall/ barn rented
3) Strict adherence to DIHP biosecurity rules
4) Curfew and quiet times must be observed between 11 pm and 5 am

PARKING/VEHICLE ACCESS: Parking is allowed in designated areas only. Vehicles parking in No Parking areas will be towed at owner's expense. DIHP is not responsible for damage to vehicles under tow. Vehicles are not allowed in the "NO ACCESS AREA" during competition, defined as Wednesday to Sunday from 4:30 am to 5:00 pm. Vehicles parked in the "NO ACCESS AREA" will be towed.

RESERVED PARKING: Reserved parking will be available Wednesday to Sunday of each competition week. Weekly passes will enable the pass holder to have a designated stall. The passes will be available on a firstcome, first-serve basis on the DIHP website. The fee for a weekly pass will be $\$ 200$ per week. Reservations will need to be made each week.

SHUTTLE SERVICE: DIHP will operate a free shuttle service around the horse park and between the barns/ tents and the parking areas.

DIHP ID BADGES AND GENERAL LIABILITY AGREEMENT: All individuals on the property, whether or not they are competing are required to obtain a photo ID and sign the DIHP general liability agreement. The application for a photo ID and the general liability agreement can be found on the DIHP website. Photos may be submitted in
advance and ID badges may be picked up at the show office during regular hours.

## SHOW OFFICE:

HOURS: The DIHP show office is open from 7:00 am to 4:30 pm each day. All transactions can be made on-line by accessing showgroundslive on our website. Assistance will be provided at the outside windows at the show office. Access to the inside of the office will be limited.

BRAIDING: Braiding is optional and horses that are not braided will not not be penalized.

TRAINER SPLITS: DIHP allows trainers to split the show charges for miscellaneous items to their clients. Splits will be accepted until noon on the Friday of a show week. No exceptions will be made. Only items billed by the horse show directly can be split. Splits will revert back to the trainer for payment if uncollected.

DAILY SCHEDULE: Entries for the next day must be completed by 4 pm the day before through showgroundslive on the DIHP website. The final ring schedule will be available at approximately 7 pm for order of go sign ups. Order of go for the Grand Prix ring and medal classes will be provided by the office. Exhibitors in classes without an office provided order of go may sign up for a slot until midnight. Notices for all of these deadlines will be sent daily on the DIHP texting service.

COMBINING, DIVIDING, OR CANCELING DIVISIONS, CLASSES, OR CLASSICS: All decisions to combine, divide, or cancel classes, divisions, or classics will be made in accordance with USEF, USHJA and other relevant affiliates rules and posted on the daily schedule on showgroundslive available on the DIHP website.

TEXTING SERVICE: Individuals can sign up to receive daily text messages on the DIHP schedule by texting 'DIHP' to 474747. Message and data rates may apply.

GOLF CART RENTALS: Golf carts may be rented at DIHP for individual use. All of the golf carts are gas powered. All golf carts will be cleaned prior to customer acceptance. Customers are responsible for cleaning their golf carts during the rental period. Golf cart rental reservations may be made at www.deverrentals.com.

PRIZE MONEY: Prize Money will be issued to the "Recipient of Prize Money" recorded on the entry within 30 days of the close of competition, thereby ending the show's responsibility as long as all criteria has been met. A valid Social Security or Federal ID number and valid address must be provided in addition to a W-9. Prize money checks will be mailed to the prize money recipient at the address on the entry blank within thirty days after the show. With advance permission from the show office, prize money may be credited to the entry's show account after the results of the class winnings are posted. If all proper tax information is not provided, the prize money will be withheld until it is provided. Classes that

do not have enough entries to pay out prize money will either be cancelled, or run without prize money at the exhibitors' option. Add Back Prize Money is computed from the number of horses that actually show. Horses entered but not shown forfeit the add back money.

Please be advised that prize money won by foreign exhibitors is subject to the US Internal Revenue Service regulation requiring sporting events to withhold $30 \%$ of prize money. Foreign exhibitors should apply for a Social Security number and will be asked to complete Form W-8BEN prior to receiving prize money.

## FACILITY INFORMATION:

Footing in the competition and warm-up areas at the Desert International Horse Park in Thermal, California is all-weather and grass. Ring sizes are posted below and may change from show week to show week. Notice will be posted on-line at the DIHP website.

Hunter 3-140' x 270' prohibited. This includes drones operated from within the horse park property as well as operated from outside the horse park boundaries and flown over the horse park property.

## FOOD SERVICE:

VIP PAVILION: The VIP Pavilion overlooks the Grand Prix Arena and the Main Hunter Arena. VIP tables are available for seating of 8,6 or 4 people. VIP is open for coffee service and breakfast starting at 7:00 am Wednesday to Sunday of each competition week. Lunch and snacks are served until 5:00 pm each day or until competition ends. Dinner is provide most Friday and Saturday evenings. Food service is provided in the main seating area as well as the assisted serving area accessed through the glass doors on the east end of the pavilion. Prices for VIP will be posted on the DIHP website and reservations can be made by emailing VIP@deserthorsepark. com. When competition is scheduled on the grass field, VIP will also be available by the side of the grass field.
DIHP FOOD PAVILION: DIHP will offer a range of food outlets at the horse park, both at the new food pavilion by Jumper 2 and by the Parlanti bar. The food pavilion will include tables and lounge furniture under a new tent on the east side of Jumper 2. Food will be provided starting at 7 am Tuesday through Sunday. A food outlet will also be set up behind permanent barn 5 .

COFFEE: Koffie Vielo will provide coffee service at their trailer located on the east side of the Grand Eq arena, next to the DIHP store.

## STABLING, PADDOCKS AND TRAILERING IN:

STABLING: DIHP offers a range of stabling options for competitions. There are two types of buildings, permanent barns with $12 \times 12$ stalls and clear span tents with $12 \times 12$ stalls. A limited number of private barns are available for lease on a long-term basis, with and without rings. All stalls include mats. Stalls may be reserved on a weekly basis during the 2022/2023 season. Weekly stalls enable us to maintain the flexibility to meet the needs of as many customers as possible intending to come to the horse park. We recognize that many customers plan to come to the horse park for extended times. For those interested in solutions that best meet their unique needs for the season, including passes for the season or circuit, please reach out to us at info@deserthorsepark.com so that we can put together a package. Custom packages must be arranged prior to September 15. Stalls are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. We cannot guarantee you will receive your preferred stabling choice. Move-in is allowed on Monday of each competition week at any time after noon. Move-out must be by Sunday at 8 pm . If you need other accommodations for move-in or move-out, please contact the DIHP office staff at stabling@deserthorsepark.com. Bedding on stall is prohibited except when the horse's health is at issue. Please obtain prior approval from the DIHP office staff at stabling@deserthorsepark.com. A clean-up fee may apply.

MATS: Mats are now provided in all permanent and clear span tents.

FEED STORE: DIHP operates a full-service feed and bedding store. This season the feed store will offer multiple brands for both feed and supplements as well as a variety of hay options. All orders must be made on-line on the DIHP website. Prices for feed, shavings, supplements, and hay are posted on-line. Third party deliveries are not allowed. Individuals bringing their own bedding may do so but may only access the barns when competition access and parking restrictions are not in place.

BARN OFFICES: Barn offices are available for rent during the season. There are two offices located in each permanent barn. Please email: jess@deserthorsepark.com for information.

PADDOCKS: DIHP has 50 paddocks which are of metal construction and are separated on all four sides by walkways. They are roughly ( $50^{\prime} \times 75^{\prime}$ ) in size and each has its own gate. Exhibitors are encouraged to bring their own locks to secure their reserved paddocks. Paddocks are NOT to be used for overnight turnout. Paddock reservations may be made on the DIHP website at www.deserthorsepark.com using our new Paddock reservation system. Preferences for location will be honored to the extent possible. Reservations are for a week at a time, Monday at noon to Monday at noon, and the price is posted on-line.

DAILY HAUL IN: Daily haul ins may be allowed in a designated space in the trailer parking area subject to new bio security rules. Electricity and water are not provided. Haul in customers are required to provide all needs to ensure the safety of their horses. Daily inspections will be made by DIHP/USEF to ensure horses are adequately cared for. The fee for haul ins will be $\$ 150 /$ horse/week. All horses hauling in must have a number and be registered in the horse show office.

## SAFETY, HEALTH \& VETERINARY:

SHARPS AND MEDICAL WASTE: In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, BioHazardous Medical Waste Containers will be provided in the stable area. Sharps \& Medical Waste must be placed in the proper receptacles. Anyone found discarding sharps or medical waste in any other manner will be fined up to $\$ 250$ per instance and be responsible for any fines and expenses incurred by management.

SHOW VETERINARIAN: Show Veterinarian is in residence on the show grounds. The Vet's phone number will be posted on line and at the Show Office.

FARRIER: Farrier is available on the show grounds during all competition days in accordance with GR1211.5.

EQUINE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: Equine Health Requirements will be enforced. All horses (competing or not) that enter the grounds are required to present the Required Health Entry Requirements, including the Event Participation Declaration and Proof of Vaccination. All horses are subject to examination by DIHP officials/designated representatives and/or state officials (collectively "officials") for determining whether such animals are, have been infected/exposed, or are likely to become infected with an infectious or contagious disease. If after such examination, officials have reason to believe that an animal's health condition places other animals at risk, such officials, at their sole discretion, may quarantine such animal (and others that may have been infected/exposed) or, if appropriate, require that such animals be transported off the grounds. All participants agree to fully cooperate with event officials and abide by their decisions and instructions. Failure to comply shall be grounds for immediate expulsion and potential disciplinary action by organization, state/local or federal animal health officials. All exhibitors are encouraged to review the equine health entry/transport requirements of the destination state prior to entry. Additional information can be obtained from the State Vet Office. New biosecurity rules will be
announced shortly.
POLING, LUNGEING AND OFFSETS: Manual poling and the use of bamboo offsets are prohibited for all horses competing at DIHP pursuant GR844. Any rider, trainer, groom or any other person who is in violation of the rules set
forth above will be fined $\$ 500$ for each incident and may be suspended from further competition. Any horse upon which a violation of the manual poling and/or use of bamboo off-sets rule will be suspended from competition. Lungeing is only allowed in designated areas.

HORSE WATCH: Barns/trainers may purchase night watch services for horses stabled on the show grounds through one of two vendors operating on the premises

SAFETY: Accidents Involving Competitors. GR1317. In the event of a head injury due to a fall/accident at a licensed competition, the competitor may be prohibited from further competition until released by medical personnel. In some cases, the competitor may not return to competition without a signed release from a licensed medical professional. The competitor may be placed on suspension by USEF until a release is provided. Competitors are advised to familiarize themselves with this rule.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes, when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee and Licensed Official are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. GR 801.2.7.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES AND GOLF CARTS: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are
exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. Only motorized vehicles in proper working condition are allowed to operate on property. ANY vehicle without proper headlights is not allowed to operate before sunrise and after sunset.

DOGS: Dogs must be restrained on the show grounds. Loose dogs will be picked up and detained and the owner fined \$100. The owner may be barred from showing and expelled from the show grounds for a second offense, or for refusal to pay the fine, and will not be entitled to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due. Management reserves the right to call Animal Control to have an animal removed from the premises. GR 1301.6

## FACILITY:

RV SPACES: DIHP has 230 individual RV spaces available for weekly rentals. The RV spaces include sewer, water, and electrical hook ups. RV space reservations may be made on the new RV reservation system on the DIHP website. The fee for RV spaces is $\$ 425 /$ week and $\$ 200 /$ non show weeks and payment can be made directly on line. DIHP will attempt as best possible to honor location preferences. Assistance on additional RV needs is available through our partners at C3RV LLC (855-331-C3RV) and Star RV and Trailer Rentals (951-445-6447). Seasonal RV Passes may be purchased for $\$ 6,500$ and covers an RV Space from October through March. Seasonal Passes must be paid in full by the end of National Sunshine Series Week I. RV passes are non refundable!

ELECTRICAL/FIRE REGULATIONS: Electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles shall be maintained clear for a minimum of six feet wide by eight feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in these aisles. No Class I Flammable Liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse show without recourse. Additional appliances are not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to confiscation of the item(s).

TENT MODIFICATIONS: Exterior Tent alterations are strictly forbidden. The removal of stall tent side poles, side ropes and/or stakes/anchors is strictly prohibited. Any exhibitor found in violation will be issued a single warning. If
violation continues, Management reserves the right to remove from the show grounds all property belonging to or under the control of said violator. Further, Management reserves the right to bar any exhibitor found to be in violation from any further participation in the horse show without recourse to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due.

DAMAGE: Owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly.

ADHERENCE TO THE RULES: All individuals on the horse park property are required to adhere to the rules mentioned in the prize list or as directed by the employees at the horse park. Trainers are all responsible for employees adhering to the rules. Violations will result in expulsion from the horse park.
