Our schedule succeeded in helping riders, trainers, and owners achieve goals from beginner to the highest levels.

Highlights:

- Kent Farrington and Conor Swail proved to be the big winners in CSI4* Grand Prix action.
- Kyle King was the ultimate National Grand Prix champion, taking home the \$100,000 rider bonus.
- Kaitlin Campbell was the Leading Open Jumper Rider and won the \$50,000 1.40m Jumper Bonus
- Nick Haness took two \$50,000 USHJA
 International Hunter Derby wins, plus the
 \$100,000 WCHR West Coast Hunter
 Spectacular, and the Leading Hunter Rider title.
- Avery Glynn proved her equitation excellence in the R.W. Mutch Equitation Championship.
- 77 riders competed for \$20,000 in prize money in the inaugural Friends of MeadowGrove Farm 1.20m Classic.
- Skylar Wireman jumped 1.70m in the inaugural \$15,000 6-Bar.
- Dogs took to Main Hunter for the USHJA
 Foundation Dog Puissance and the Ariat Tails
 Over Rails to benefit Thrive Animal Rescue.
- Andover, owned by Cathy Morris Schmidt, and Joie Gatlin won the \$10,000 DIHP Under Saddle Championship.

- Chelsea Brittner and Berry De Maillet took the win in the \$25,000 El Cristiano USHJA International Hunter Derby.
- Nick Haness and True That won the \$10,000 HorseFlight USHJA National Hunter Derby - Open during WCHR week.
